SHOWTIME

VCOI FALL FIELD TRIAL

Please mark your calendars now. September 20 & 21 are the dates for the VCOI Fall Field Trial at Green River near Ohio, Ill. This is a month and a half earlier than it has been in the past, so be prepared! The stakes that will be run are Open Limited Gun Dog - Open Derby - Amateur Gun Dog - Open Puppy - Open Gun Dog in that order. The three Gun dog stakes are with bird field shooting to be done by handler. Derby and Puppy will be no bird field. Pheasants will be used in the bird field for the Gun dog stakes and will be released on course for the Derby. The Puppy stake will be (Note!!!) FOR VIZSLAS ONLY and while no birds will be released, there should be plenty around from the three preceeding stakes. The judges are two long time Vizsla men - Dr. Paul Rothan and Len Hartl, both of whom are past presidents of the Vizsla Club of America. Field Trial headquarters will be on the grounds and while there will be no official banquet, there will be a dinner for the judges at the Ramada Inn in Dixon where the judges will be staying. NO horseback handling will be allowed in any stake. Our trial will be on the same weekend as the Four Lakes GSPC being held at Portage, Wisconsin. It is unlikely that most professional handlers with large strings of dogs will prefer to attend the VCOI trial. This fact coupled with the gun dog terrain of the Green River Wildlife Area will make our trial very desirable to attend for Vizsla owners and area amateur owners of other breeds. If I'm right, since we only have a capacity to handle 80-85 dogs, it will be essential for you to get your entries in as quickly as possible when they are received by you. If you have any doubts whether you are on the mailing list, please send Linda Busch, F.T. Sec., R.R.#1, Poplar Grove, Ill. 61065 a post card with your name and address.

ATTENTION - IMPORTANT - - - For AKC field trials your dog is a PUPPY until its 15 month birthday - it is not necessary to point or retrieve to place in this event - no birds will be killed - blanks will not even be fired in the Puppy. Your dog is a Derby until its two year birthday - your dog must find and point game to place - the point does not have to last a long time and the dog does not have to point every bird it finds - once is enough if the judges see it - a retrieve is not necessary since no birds will be killed - merely blanks fired on game contact. In both of these events the dog must be six months old by the first day of the trial, Sept. 20th. This year we have had two fun trials and have seen many fine young Vizslas - enter them in one or both of these events. Field trials are just as much fun and no more difficult for you and your dog than our fun trials. As a matter of fact, come to the fun trial at Busch's again on September 21 - see the article elsewhere in the news for more details. 12

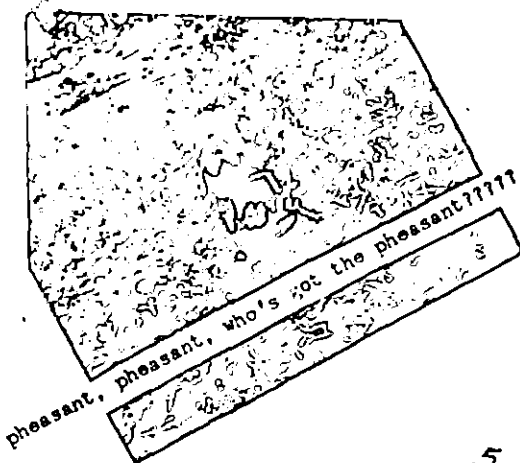

FIRST CLASS

ANOTHER FUN TRIAL
SEPTEMBER 1st. AT BUSCH'S

To help everyone prepare for our field trial, we're going to have another fun trial at Busch's (see map) place. This will give all the owners of young dogs another chance to practice before the AKC field trial on September 20-21. It will also give our seasoned field trial dogs and our young green-broke gun dogs one more chance to practice in competition. The Hunting Dog stake will provide action for the older dogs who are PHDs (Personal Hunting Dogs) and a chance for them to warm up for the coming Hunting season. Broke dogs and hunting dogs will be able to earn the coveted "Certified Hunting Dog" award and also the "Dog of the Day" award. Hungers bear in mind that the highly prized Dog of the Day award has not been won by a field trial dog for many years. Come early and stay late. Beverages will be provided by the Vizsla Club of Ill. but bring your own lunch. We will have several grills burning but you'll have to bring your own entree.

The stakes will be just like an AKC trial as of the date of our field trial except younger dogs will be allowed to compete and age will be taken into consideration. For the fun trial you may only enter each dog once (at a field trial you can enter more than one stake as long as your dog meets the necessary requirements of the stake).

Puppy & Derby (starting time 8:00 a.m.) (VIZSLAS ONLY)

Puppy up to 15 months as of sept. 20, 1975 \$5.00

Derby up to two years and of Sept. 20, 1975 \$8.00

Puppy and Derby will run simultaneously i.e., one brace of Derby followed by one brace of Puppy followed by one brace of Derby, etc. Three Pheasants will be put down for each brace of Derby - three Pigeons for each brace of Puppy. This will be judging nightmare, but will give us maximum use of the birds.

Broke Gun Dogs * (Starting time not before 11:00 a.m.) for all Vizslas and other pointing breeds belonging to members of the VCOI. Also, the VCOI invites members of the German Wirehaired Pointer Club of Ill. to enter their GWP gun dogs in this stake.

Everyone please, Green Broke is O.K., unbroke no!!!

The course is short and tight, so if your Gun Dog is more All-Age than Gun Dog, beware, The corn is 10 ft. tall and goes on and on and on. Three Pheasants in the bird field - official guns - AKC Gun Dog rules. \$8.00 Hunting Dog (Vizsla Only), any age. (Starting time not before 2:00 p.m.) Three Pheasants in bird field - official guns. Cost \$8.00

Birds killed over your dogs are yours to take home. Ribbons to four placing dogs in each event. Some special award trophies to be given. Enter on the grounds but please have your dogs AKC name, your name and address, dogs call name all written on an envelope with the correct entry fee inside when you arrive. SEE YOU SEPTEMBER 1st. HELPING THE NEWCOMER, by C.J. Somers submitted by Betty Solberg

There always have been and probably always will be newcomers in the dog game. Whether their interest will develop to the point of becoming dedicated breeders and exhibitors will, at least partly, be determined by the help and encouragement that we give to them. We should take the time to be friendly and we should be constructively helpful by answering their numerous questions to the best of our ability, as it probably won't take a novice long to become thoroughly confused because "everyone" will give him or her a different viewpoint.

No breeder should attempt to thoroughly "engulf" a beginner in order to insure a future sale and perhaps even more business. A novice should be encouraged to attend shows and matches, to meet other breeders and other people, to read everything that he can manage to find, to attend meetings and then, eventually to make his own decisions.

New enthusiasts shouldn't buy the first puppy that is offered them. They should be cautious about signing leases or getting involved in "deals". If they have to wait a few extra months to acquire capital to make their first purchase, it will give them more time to become knowledgeable. They should determine what type and what bloodlines especially appeal to them and then they should take their time in finding what they really want. The puppy should also be of sufficient age to determine that its quality is well established. Getting off to the right start is so important.



Prospective purchasers should not be hesitant about discussing prices and determining what a "realistic" charge should be for the quality of puppy desired. Most reputable breeders evaluate their puppies honestly and their prices are firm. Much time and effort have gone into producing a quality puppy and the puppy must be priced accordingly.

Along with being helpful, breeders

should be alert for the beginner who thinks that the business is easy. Some have the wrong conception, thinking that all they need is a good dog and they can walk into the ring and win. They can't comprehend the long hours and days of conditioning and grooming and the experience required to handle a dog to look its best.

There will be some novices who

expect you to do all the work gratis and then they can walk into the ring and win. This is doing them an injustice. Rather, you should help them to help themselves. Only when they start to progress on their own initiative will they be potential winners. If we can help one on his way, our reward should be his success in the years ahead. Let's all start the novices on the winning road by pointing them in the right direction and extending a helping hand.
