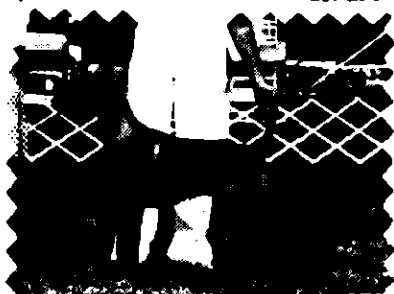
The Christmas party will be Dec. 6th and will include a family style dinner-games-gifts(everyone gets a gift)

PUPPIES DUE EARLY FEBRUARY

HEART WORM STUDY HAS ENCOURAGING RESULTS,

as printed in Dec. 1975 issue of "Hunting Dog" Magazine,
submitted by Joyce Smith

A study to improve methods for the diagnosis of heartworms in dogs has been completed at the Papanicolaou Cancer Research Institute, Miami, with encouraging results.

Norman H. Altman, V.M.D., reported the purpose of the study was to develop a means to induce microfilariae (the immature stages of the heartworm) to circulate in dogs infected with the disease. This would make it easier for veterinarians to diagnose heartworms using standard laboratory techniques currently available.

One of the more common methods of diagnosis is through finding these immature stages of the worm circulating in the blood. A dog may be heavily infested with the parasite and require treatment but have circulating levels of microfilariae too low to be detected.

The study to improve methods of diagnosis was funded by The Seeing Eye, Inc., Morristown, N. J., through Morris Animal Foundation, Denver.

Heartworm disease in dogs is widespread throughout the country. The disease can cause serious damage to the dog and is difficult to treat once it reaches advanced stages. Early diagnosis and treatment are therefore important.

For heartworms to go through their various stages of development in a dog takes from four to six months. The diagnosis is based on finding the immature worms, which are the end product of the life cycle, so by the time the immature worms can be detected the parasites have been in the dog for at least three, and perhaps five or six, months.

The worms actually obstruct the flow of blood in the heart and may also affect the lungs, liver and kid-

neys. Dogs with heartworms may be lethargic, usually have a cough, and may have skin trouble, loss of weight, dull hair coats and little stamina. The disease can result in death.

Dr. Altman and his research team have found that dexamethasone, a corticosteroid drug, did increase the number of microfilariae circulating through the blood, making diagnosis more accurate.

They also found that other drugs that may be used in diagnosis are not effective and can even cause the number of circulating worms to decrease.

Dr. Altman said, "As with most projects, this one raised many questions which have yet to be answered. Thanks to the support of The Seeing Eye, Inc., and Morris Animal Foundation, I can continue to work in this important area." MD
