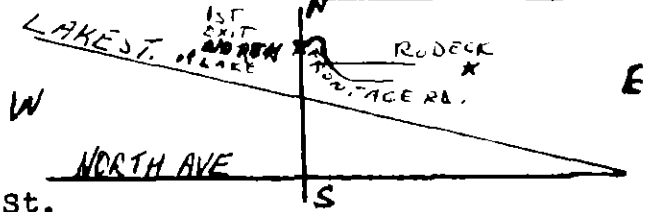

- President Geno Woehrle convened the VCOI January Meeting at 7:37PM and called for:
1. The Minutes of the Nov. Meeting to be read. Read and accepted by the membership present.
  2. The Treasurer's Report. Treasurer Iris Pechota gave her report and it was accepted by the membership present.

President Geno Woehrle then called for a report from the March F.T. Committee. F.T. Sec. Ken Crago told the membership that:

1. all the Judges have been selected and persons asked accepted.
2. Horses have been reserved
3. birds will be no problem

Ken then went onto explain to the membership that costs have increased in running trials. He pointed out that 1983 March trial will cost the VCI almost \$100 more to run than the 1982 March trial. This is mainly due to increased fees for the use of State field grounds.

President Woehrle then called for OLD BUSINESS to be conducted. It consisted mainly of '83 election of VCOI Officers and Board of Director vacancies created by ending terms. The Nominating Committee, Tony Lucas, Ken Crago, and Dr. Doug Trevin recommended the following slate to the membership.

Retiring VCI Officers were President Geno Woehrle and Board of Director: Members Vern Fasse, Kathy Harmer, and John Pecora.

The membership voted on and passed the slate proposed by the Nominating Committee.

President Geno Woehrle then called for New Business, New Business consisted of:

1. the membership being informed of a slight increase in entry registration fee collected by the AKC for show entries.
2. nominating Tony Lucas as the VCI candidate to the VCA Hall of Fame Committee.

At 8:27PM the membership adjourned the business meeting to view movies taken by Dr. Arthur Reinitz. Dr. Reinitz made a trip to Hungary last year, where he had the opportunity to view and film Hungarian Field trials and shows. He was brought to the meeting by Penny Parsons and stayed to talk about some of his experiences in Hungary. After the presentation, the membership enjoyed refreshments and a social hour.

January 9th, 1983, the VCI hosted the 2nd annual DesPlaines Field Trial Association, All-Breed Amateur Invitational in Joliet, Ill., with entries and help from the Vizsla community. Chuck Boegel, Ken Crago, Tony Lucas, Doug Trevin & Geno Woehrle came out and enjoyed commendable performances by their dogs. The DesPlaines F.T. Assoc. consists of 9 breed clubs, The VCI, Ft. Dearborn GSP club, the Gordon Setter club, German Wirehaired club, LaSalle Brittany club, Northern Ill. Irish Setter club, Weimaraner club, Western Irish and Western Pointer club.

Local trialers have been worried for years about the possible loss of their trial grounds. As the areas become more populated, more state grounds are turned into parks. In the case of the DesPlaines Wildlife area, Managements efforts are mainly put into improving the campgrounds and fishing areas.

In 1981 an opportunity arose for the local trialer to put his best foot forward, by each club getting members together to rebuild an old house, destined to be torn down, on the wildlife area. That work included replacing the furnace, plumbing, roof, electricity, paint, etc. A barn was put up, with the field trial community working on the woodwork inside, the fence and the gravel around the building.

The clubs contribute equally with the finances involved in keeping up the house. Volunteers for workdays during the year are always welcome.

The 1984 DesPlaines F.T. Assoc. Amateur Invitational will be hosted by the LaSalle Brittany club.

Congratulations to Richard Zappacosta and Sage Richards. They finished the final requirements for her field championship thus becoming another dual champion Vizsla.

Richard is a past director of the VCA from New York. He is well liked by everyone and his accomplishment must have brought joy to many. Sage Richards is no youngster. My records show her first gun dog placement in 1978. In 1979 she had two firsts, including a 4 point open win which satisfied that all-important and tough-to-get open major. She took time out to raise several litters of puppies. One of her offspring is Ch. Boyd's Kerek Richards, a perennial top ten gun dog. I'm sure that Richard thought that the F.C. title would fall right into place when he earned that four pointer in 1979. The years came and went until 1982 (Oct) when the final points fell into place. How sweet it must be. I know what it is like to have 9 points and to watch the blue ribbons elude your best efforts. I've done it twice. Congratulations again Richard. The whole Vizsla world rejoices and celebrates your happiness and relief with you.

Richard is an amateur trainer and handler. There are not many of us left. The east coast especially suffers from a shortage of amateur Vizsla field trainers. The presence of four professional trainers and handlers makes it hard for the amateur to place there. This is not entirely an east coast phenomenon. Look at the open top ten list. There are only two Amateur trained and handled dogs on the list. Both dogs are from Ohio, Timmy and Jeri. The owners, Paul Rothan and Cliff Boggs, each have close to 20 years experience training and competing with Vizslas. Paul Rothan is the only amateur to place in the open National Championship in the last two years.

The pros are getting tougher. They have more dogs and the dogs are better trained. The top amateurs are still competitive, but there are fewer of them. As their ranks thin, it becomes harder and harder to maintain a large pool of amateur handlers and trainers. It becomes harder and harder to find someone to train with. When there are three or four amateurs in an area, they tend to train more often because someone is always hot to train and galvanizes the others into action. If you're by yourself, other activities have a way of consuming your time.

I find it sad that this evolution is taking place. I guess it is to be expected because the open stakes at American Field Trials frequently find few amateurs entered. Somehow when the pro has so many entries that he ends up with his dogs braced with each other, a lot of the fun goes out of the sport.

I have no solution to this problem. Perhaps relief lies in the "EMGAM" philosophy of my Moose club, Every Member Get A Member. If each of us involved in field trialing vows that this year he will take one newcomer by the hand and introduce him to our sport, our numbers will be doubled next year. Of course not everyone will stick, but some will. Don't just get him to pay an entry fee, come to the trial and flop. Train with him, talk to him, cheer his successes and commiserate over his failures. If you do this on an on-going basis, the sport will expand and your pleasure will multiply.

Last fall the VCOI ran a 92 dog single course trial. Of those 92 entries, over 50 were there because of direct or indirect action of Tony Lucas and/or Jim Busch. I'm not tooting my own horn. I'm just using our experience as an example of what can be accomplished with constant effort over a long period of time.

Let's keep our sport healthy. EMGAM for the spring season!

Vizslas are HUNTING DOGS but, sad to say, not everyone who owns a Vizsla hunts. Most Vizsla owners never hunt and only a tiny minority hunt regularly with their Vizslas. During the season I try to go hunting at least two times a week. There is no substitute for developing an outstanding bird dog i.e., take him hunting. When you go hunting as often as I do, it becomes difficult to find someone to go with you all the time. It is imperative that you try to turn every non-hunting friend into at least an occasional hunter. I spent a considerable amount of time working on Tom Harmer. An off-hand remark he made one day got him committed to take a pup out of Sharon Schroader's "Babe". Sharon and I connived to give Tom a pup least likely to win a dog show. We figured that if it had any potential in the ring at all, it (and Tom) might never see the field. Tom got "Jake", I got Askim, and Tom as a hunting buddy. Jake proved better than good and Tom ended up field trialing also.

Sharon and Bob sold another of the pups to Ed and Kathy Kottmeier from St. Louis. The Kottmeiers also own Babe's brother Rusty, a show dog. I spent a lot of time trying to talk Bob & Sharon, and Ed & Kathy into doing some hunting, joining a hunt club, anything. I got a lot of "yeah, yeah, I know, I've got to but next week, month, etc. It's inventory time, I've got a case to try, my partner is sick, etc. etc. The state of Illinois has about eight public hunting areas. It's a great program. You can apply for a permit that allows you and a buddy to hunt at a given area on a given date. Not everyone shows up to use their permit, so usually if you are near the front of the non-permit waiting line, you are allowed to sign up to hunt after the 8:00 a.m. permit sign-in deadline. In the process of applying to hunt the Green River Area, which is closest to home, I noticed that one area in south east Illinois had no filled up dates. I theorized that this meant that getting in without a permit should be a cinch, even on the weekend.

The area is approximately half way (3 hours) between St. Louis and Louisville, Ky, and about six hours south of Poplar Grove. We made plans way in advance. Bob & Sharon would drive in from Louisville, Ed & Kathy would drive in from St. Louis, and we would all hunt Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. We all needed a license. Non-licensed people are not allowed on the areas - which gave us a 12 bird limit each day. Linda and I attended the Gateway Vizsla Club Christmas party, along with the Schroaders. Our ulterior motive was to finalize our hunting plans for the coming weekend. We had a great time staying with the Kottmeiers, and the Gateway group served up a delicious meal followed by a raffle and gift exchange. Linda was thrilled when she won a beautiful ceramic piece of an old man with his Vizsla. Most everyone had expressed a desire to win it as well as all the other neat items club members had donated to the raffle. The Kottmeiers are warm friendly people, and poor Kathy was put to the test when I kept insisting that On Saturday afternoon, just hours prior to the party, that they all trek out to find a place that would sell them their out-of-state hunting licenses. I'm sure she could have chewed nails.

Schroaders took a detour on their way home and "checked-out" the Richland County Area. They spotted a hotel in Olney to stay at, checked the grounds, and found out that the waiting line did not work quite the same as at Green River. We were going to have to be signed up by 5:00 a.m. The following Thursday we rolled into Olney about 8:30 p.m. and almost ran into Bob and Sharon in the motel parking lot. Kottmeiers would be arriving Friday evening, so after a quick dinner and finalizing plans, we were off to bed. Up at 4:00 a.m., cold and dark, and wet, we drove to the sign in building at 5:30 and picked up numbers 13 to 16 from the "Commander" (USN Retired). Linda and Sharon stopped all conversation as they walked in, and afterawhile a couple of the old timers moseyed over to see what our story was. Hunting did not start until 9:00 a.m., so we wiled away the time eating a delicious breakfast cooked by the locals, and learned the best places to hunt from the Commander.

We hunted all day Friday, mostly in the rain, in muddy fields, and in the wrong places. We got three birds. As the day came to a close, we reconned the area and found spots much better suited for our dogs. We

also decided that the birds were let out right at roadside, so if you weren't ready to fire the minute you stepped out of your vehicle, you would probably miss a shot at two or three birds right off the bat. We cleaned up at the motel, ate dinner, and prayed that Ed and Kathy wouldn't be in until we hit the sack. We were too tired for socializing Five a.m. Saturday found all six of us back at the check-in station with numbers 6 - 11. We hunted all day and got our 12th bird at 3:30, just half an hour before closing. Sunday we scrapped our bodies out of bed at 5:00 a.m. again. Ed, Bob and I went to the grounds and got waiting line numbers, then we hit the sack for a couple more hours of sleep. We almost had our limit by noon on Sunday in a area we called the "pheasant bedroom", but it took us until 3:00 to limit out. We ended the day by stopping in Olney at a little restaurant to replenish our bodies and reflect upon the weekend's activities.

We got plenty of birds, but more importantly, Kate Babe became a HUNTING DOG, and the owners became HUNTERS. water 2 uncooked hotdogs

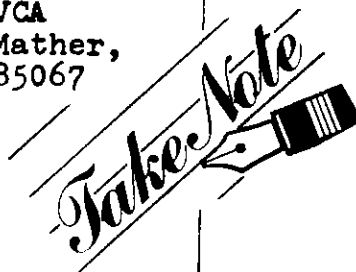
Dissolve boullion in boiling water. Cut hotdogs in 1" slices. Sift dry ingredients
