MEETING MINUTES

New Officers for 1990 were installed: President, Mark Johnson, Vice-President, Kathy Harmer, Secretary - Gwen Tomlinson, Treasurer - Iris Pechota. **New Board of Director members:** Jim Busch, Bill Lyman and Geno Woehrle.

What Is Ethoxyquin? (ee-thox-i-quin)

Ethoxyquin is an organic, man-made antioxidant developed during the early decades of this century. It was patented by a major British pharmaceutical company in the 1930's.

In the 1950's, after extensive, long-term safety studies, the United States Food and Drug Administration approved the use of ethoxyquin as a preservative in pet food and certain human food products.

Since then it has become well-known and highly regarded for its effective protection of essential vitamins, fatty acids and other nutrients.

Many nutritionists prefer ethoxyquin over other antioxidants (such as BHT and BHA) because lower quantities of ethoxyquin are required to achieve the same preservative effects.

Ethoxyquin is used in virtually every major pet food (including many "all natural" products) and is present at levels no higher than 1/1000 of an ounce per average daily serving.

What Beneficial Functions Does Ethoxyquin Perform In Pet Foods?

Ethoxyquin functions as an antioxidant to preserve the quality of pet food.

1. It prevents the degradation of vitamins such as A, C, D, E, and K.
2. It prevents the deterioration of essential fatty acids and other nutrients.
3. It prevents the formation of dangerous toxins due to fat oxidation and rancidity.
4. It protects flavor, aroma and texture.

Note: According to Dr. James E. Colburn (Professor Emeritus at the University of Illinois) and other researchers, ethoxyquin also has "antitumor and anti-ulcer activities."

Why This Fact Sheet About Ethoxyquin?

Skepticism about compounds newly approved by the FDA is not uncommon in certain quarters. Such skepticism generally passes as the compound establishes itself over years of actual use.

This is why researchers are rather surprised that, in the absence of any new data, anyone would raise serious questions about ethoxyquin. With its decades-long record of safety and effectiveness, ethoxyquin seems a most unlikely candidate for adverse rumors.

Nonetheless, a few individuals outside the scientific community have, for whatever reason, made negative claims about this ingredient in pet and human food products. Therefore, the questions and answers in this folder have been compiled for the benefit of pet food retailers, professional breeders and pet owners.

If something you've heard has caused you concern, the facts are herein available to give you an honest and objective evaluation. As you'll find, there are no opinions in this folder; only the evidence of research and clinical experience.

Has The FDA Determined The Proper Level Of Ethoxyquin To Be Used In Pet Foods?

Yes. Ethoxyquin is effective as a preservative at the permitted level of just 1/1000 of an ounce per average daily serving.

Is There Actual Proof That Ethoxyquin Is Safe?

"...I have found no reports of any adverse effects of this compound (ethoxyquin). On the contrary, I have found evidence that in addition to preventing rancidity, ethoxyquin may also act as an anticancer agent, and it helps protect against the toxic effects of mutagens."

Is Ethoxyquin Used As An Insecticide Or Herbicide?

No. According to the maker of ethoxyquin, the Animal Sciences Division of Monsanto, it "has never been recommended or sold... as an insecticide or herbicide."

An extremely crude form of ethoxyquin is used as an antioxidant to stabilize rubber but this is not to be compared to the much more refined grade of ethoxyquin used in pet and human food products.

Why Not Use "All Natural" Preservatives?

Vitamin C and Vitamin E have been mentioned as preservatives and they can, in fact, function as antioxidants. However, research has shown they are significantly less effective than ethoxyquin so are much more valuable as nutrients than preservatives.

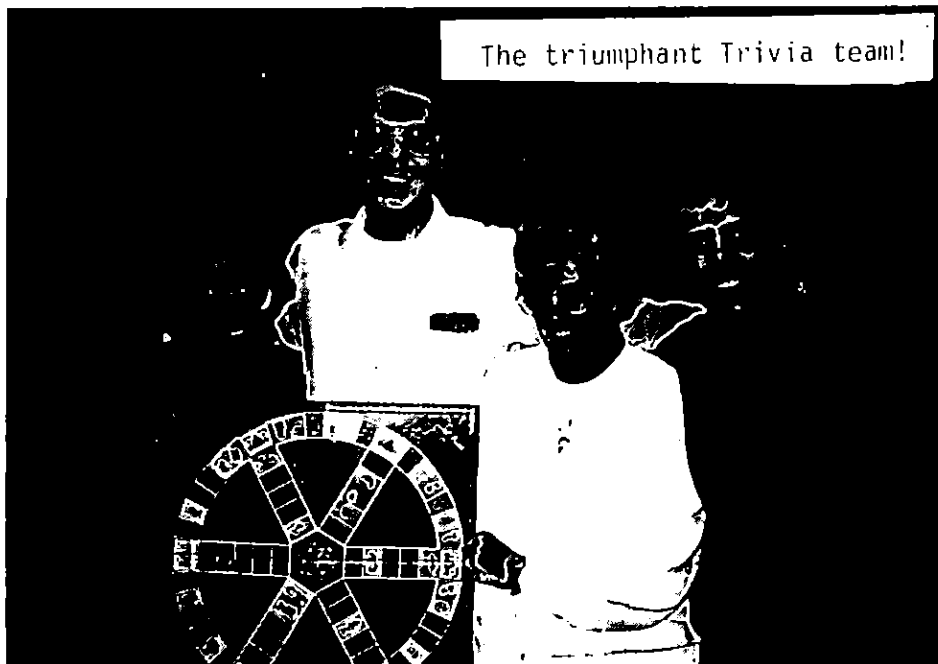
First, without an antioxidant like ethoxyquin to protect them, Vitamins C and E, as well as other vitamins and nutrients, tend to be destroyed in the pet food manufacturing process.

Second, when used at a level high enough to be effective, Vitamin E can become toxic.

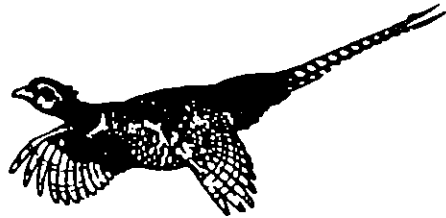

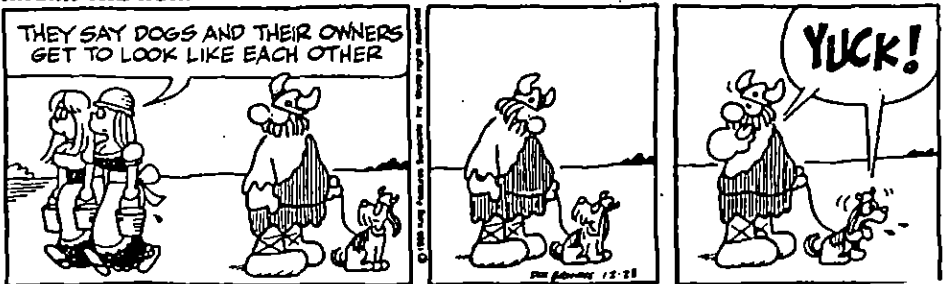

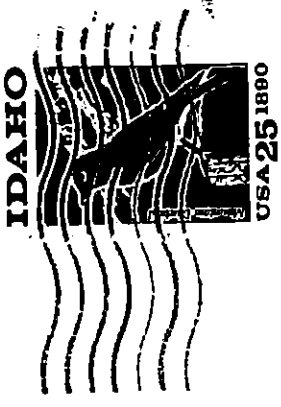
