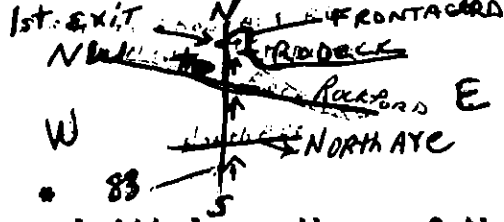

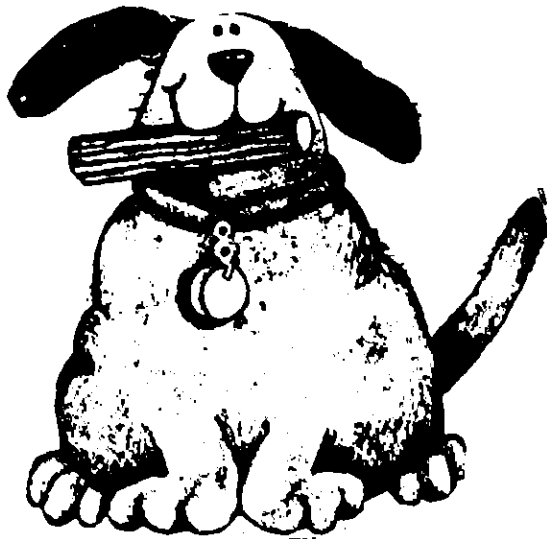

ON THE COVER are some of our accomplished obedience competitors. Alsuz "Remy" Somerset C.D.X., T.D. earned her most recent obedience title in 1980 with scores of 192, 193 and 187 in Open for a C.D.X. and is in training for her Utility degree. However, her proudest moment was when she earned her tracking degree. To complete this AKC title a dog and handler must first be certified by an AKC judge as being able to track over a man-laid track aged between a half hour and two hours old, from 440 yards to 500 yards long with at least two turns. "Remy" passed her certification in March and was entered in Lyons Township Dog Training Club's tracking trial, 4/4. Under trying conditions (extremely windy, mostly dead grass cover) "Remy" tracked her way through approximately 480 yards and 4 turns to find that glorious glove at the end of the track. Judges were Mr. Ted Haesel/Mr. Dave Behrens. "REMY" is out of VCA NFC., NAFC., DCH.AFC. Brook's Willie Whompum x Lobo Iskra Zha Zha - owner/trainer/handler Sue Ruginis

Golden Lady T C.D. earned her title with scores in Novice A of 194½ (4th pl. in division) 189½, 192½ highest scoring Vizsla, 191 and 187½. Grad. Novice 191½, 4th pl. and 195½, 4th pl. "Taffy" is the first dog that I have trained and shown in obedience competition, and the 2nd Vizsla I have owned. We bought "Taffy" in the fall of 1978. A better dog for obedience, companion and hunting would be hard to find. The Vizsla loves their owner so much, it seems to me, you have to be prepared to receive and give a lot of affection. That is their favorite thing. One of the most important types of conditioning, I have found, is to take them everywhere when they are young and make sure they are exposed to the new and novel, without babying them. The Vizsla is very attuned to the feelings of people and their surroundings, which makes them very responsive to training. "Taffy" is out of CH.Evelyns' Red Pride x Maggie III. owner/trainer/handler Gwen Tomlinson

Two of our most consistent competitors are CH.Rotkopf's Sensational "Robin" C.D.X. and CH.Puff the Golden Dragon C.D.X. "Annie" Robin finished her CH. title at the age of 13 months. Major accomplishments include BOB over male specials at the '79 Chicago Int. for 3 points; and RWB at the MVVC Specialty, WB for 5 points at Cincinnati K.C. the same wknd. Finishing with WB, BOW & BOS over specials at the VCI Specialty show. "Robin" is currently on the VCA top ten in Obedience, and working toward her UD. "Robin" is out of CH.Mako Makk x CH.Rotkopf's Regina of Sageacre. Owner/trainer/handler Joyce Smith. "Annie" is also, o/t/h/ by Joyce Smith. A dog that never needs a leash and with only 6 months training, she obtained her CD and CDX in a total of 7 trials, and #2 obedience Vizsla in the country in 1976. Delaney system with a total of 104 points. (1 point for each dog defeated).

CH. The Baron of Batavia owner/ trained/ handled by George Peirce, first made his appearance at the fun and field trials, putting down respectable puppy/derby performances. "Baron" is on his way to earning a C.D. with the 1st two legs out of the way already. He is out of DCH.AFC.Jodi's JumpN'Bing Bang Bucz x CH.Piper's Sunburst Abigail.

Comments by the Judges were in the positive, even the classic "They were better than I thought they would be", the Judge said to one person a couple weeks later in conversation. Our late start was due to one Judge having to build a bridge in his driveway, in order to get his vehicle and horse trailer out, due to flooding. For the first time since I have been preparing top ten lists, the March Gazette contained trial results that changed the final standings

Voros Tars Duke belonging to Bud Chambers of California and handled by Bill Gibbons of Arizona took a third in the Open Limited Gun Dog at the GSP of Las Cruces trial that was worth 18 points. Those 18 points catapulted Duke from obscurity to the #9 spot in the 1981 final. Sadly, this drops Willie's Cactus Flower to #10 and Behi Caecse Gyors Lab (Fleeta) drops into obscurity.

On the Amateur list there were also changes, BUT no one loses as a result of those changes. Biol Boyd's Ch. Boyd's Kerek Richards picked up a 28 point Amateur Gun Dog win at the Gordon Setter of America Trial. This moves Kerek from #7 on the Amateur list to a tie with Ed for the #2 spot. Super Star, Midge, and Dark Star all move up one slot as a result to #7, #8, and #9 respectively. This leaves #10 open and J. Frayne's Fieldway's Arlor Sam's Ransom occupies that spot with 110 pts.

Here is a new prince among amateur handlers. Kelley Donham of Iowa added the Amateur Field Champion title to Spring Creek Edition at the VCOI spring trial. One week later at the Vizsla Club of Nebraska trial, Kelley finished Winneshiek Spotmatic as both a Field Champion and an Amateur Field Champion - all pending AKC verification. Kelley earns his princehood by having finished four dogs in the field. They were FC/AFC Doc's Spot, FC Rebel Rouser Winneshiak Mac, FC/AFC Spring Creek Edition, and FC/AFC Winneshiek Spotmatic (Spot's daughter). Kelley joins Prince Roy Stephenson (Caebasz, Sparky, Whiz Kid and Minor Miracle), and Prince Paul Holzworth (Honey, Rita, Pride, and Victor). Of course all three of these princes must finish one more to catch up to the King, Cliff Boggs, who has put field titles on five Vizslas (Trixie, Caecse, Piri, Fleeta, and Jeri).

99 There are others who have finished dogs in the field in bunches, but 98 they have turned professional and by doing so have abdicated their 97 titles.

92 There are several topics that are NOT items of conversation at Vizsla 86 gatherings. #1 - should bitches in season be allowed to run at the 68 Nationals? Intellectually I agree with those who want them to be allowed to run. BUT, if I were given the opportunity to vote on the subject, I would vote to NOT allow them to run. The National events are complicated enough to run without creating additional problems. Allowing bitches in season to run has the potential to hurt more people than it would help. When it comes right down to it, "If you don't want to do something, one excuse is as good as another." And, I just don't want them there.

228 #2 - Should the Puppy stake be eliminated from the Nationals? I agree 159 with the Board's decision to eliminate the Puppy Stake. I think that 143 eventually the Derby Stake should be eliminated also. However, before 139 that is done, the Puppy/Derby Top Ten should be eliminated from the 108 Vizsla NEWS. The VCA has indicated it's concern about the rumored 97 cross-breeding that is taking place within our breed by placing a 70 statement condemning the practice on the inside cover of the VCA NEWS. 64 This is called "jawboning", ie., trying to talk someone into or out of 62 doing something without actually doing anything concrete. Elimination 60 of the Puppy Stake and Derby Stake at the Nationals and elimination of 60 the Puppy/Derby Top Ten from the VCA NEWS would ELIMINATE three of the - National arenas in which the VCA allows the crossbreeds to shine. That would be doing something concrete.

Just so there is no misunderstanding, Jim Busch said all of that!
