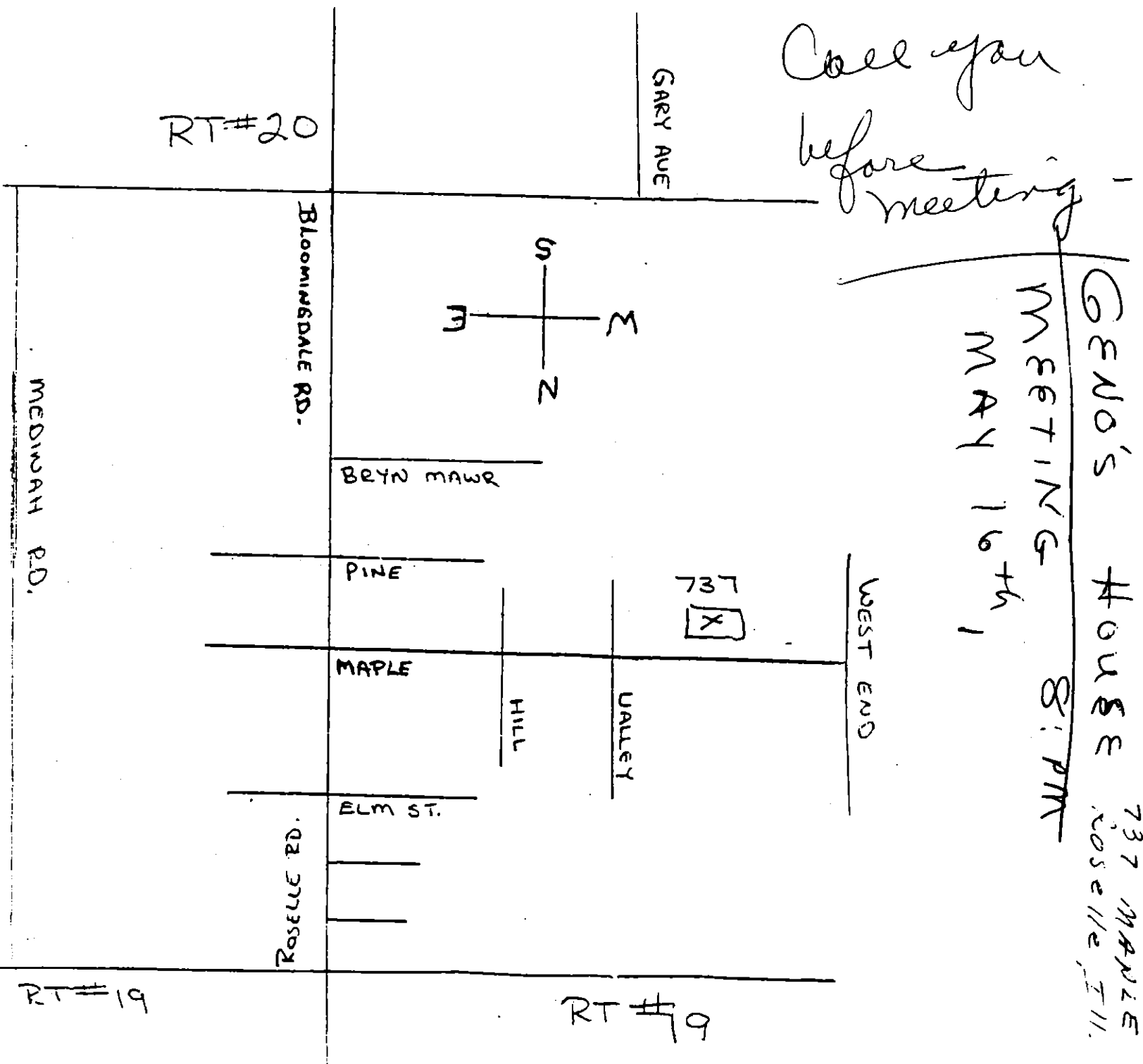

VCI March 1984 meeting:

Revised Standard for Vizslas

The Board of Directors of The American Kennel Club has approved the following revised Standard for Vizslas as submitted by the Vizsla Club of America, Inc.:

General Appearance—That of a medium sized short coated hunting dog of distinguished appearance and bearing.

Robust but rather lightly built; the coat is an attractive solid golden rust. This is a dog of power and drive in the field yet a tractable and affectionate companion in the home. It is strongly emphasized that field conditioned coats, as well as brawny or sinewy muscular condition and honorable scars indicating a working and hunting dog are never to be penalized in this dog. The qualities that make a "dual dog" are always to be appreciated not deprecated.

Head—Lean and muscular. Skull moderately wide between the ears with a median line down the forehead. Stop between skull and forehead is moderate, not deep. Foreface or muzzle is of equal length or slightly shorter than skull when viewed in profile, should taper gradually from stop to tip of nose. Muzzle square and deep. It must not turn up as in a "dish" face nor should it turn down. Whiskers serve a functional purpose; their removal is permitted but not preferred. Nostrils slightly open. Nose brown. Any other color is faulty. *A totally black nose is a disqualification.* Ears, thin, silky and proportionately long, with rounded-leather ends, set fairly low and hanging close to cheeks. Jaws are strong with well developed white teeth meeting in a scissors bite. Eyes medium in size and depth of setting, their surrounding tissue covering the whites. Color of the iris should blend with the color of the coat. Yellow or any other color is faulty. Prominent pop-eyes are faulty. Lower eyelids should neither turn in nor out since both conditions allow seeds and dust to irritate the eye. Lips cover the jaws completely but are neither loose nor pendulous.

Neck and Body—Neck strong, smooth and muscular, moderately long, arched and devoid of dewlap, broadening nicely into shoulders which are moderately laid back. This is mandatory to maintain balance with the moderately angulated hind quarters. Body is strong and well proportioned. Back short. Withers high and the topline slightly rounded over the loin to the set on of the tail. Chest moderately broad and deep reaching down to the elbows. Ribs well-sprung; underline exhibiting a slight tuck-up beneath the loin. Tail set just below the level of the croup, thicker at the root and docked one-third off. Ideally, it should reach to the back of the stifle joint and be carried at or near the horizontal. An undocked tail is faulty.

Forequarters—Shoulder blades proportionately long and wide sloping moderately back and fairly close at the top. Forelegs straight and muscular with elbows

close. Feet cat-like, round and compact with toes close. Nails brown and short. Pads thick and tough. Dewclaws, if any, to be removed on front and rear feet. Hare feet are faulty.

Hindquarters—Hind legs have well developed thighs with moderately angulated stifles and hocks in balance with the moderately laid back shoulders. They must be straight as viewed from behind. Too much angulation at the hocks is as faulty as too little. The hocks are let down and parallel to each other.

Coat—Short, smooth, dense and close-lying, without woolly undercoat.

Color—Solid golden rust in different shadings. Solid dark Mahogany red and pale yellow are faulty. Small white spots on chest are not faulted but massive areas of white on chest or white anywhere else on the body is a disqualification. Occasional white hairs on toes are acceptable but solid white extending above the toes is a disqualification. White due to aging shall not be faulted. Any noticeable area of black in the coat is a serious fault.

Gait—Far reaching, light footed, graceful and smooth. When moving at a fast trot, a properly built dog single tracks.

Size—The ideal male is 22 to 24 inches at the highest point over the shoulder blades. The ideal female is 21 to 23 inches. Because the Vizsla is meant to be a medium-sized hunter, any dog measuring more than 1½ inches over or under these limits must be disqualified.

Temperament—A natural hunter endowed with a good nose and above-average ability to take training. Lively, gentle-mannered, demonstrably affectionate and sensitive though fearless with a well developed protective instinct. Shyness, timidity or nervousness should be penalized.

Disqualifications

Completely black nose.

Massive areas of white on chest.

White anywhere else on the body.

Solid white extending above the toes.

Any male over 25½ inches, or under 20½ inches and any female over 24½ inches or under 19½ inches at the highest point over the shoulder blades.

VERSATILITY CERTIFICATE

These Tests are to help in the overall improvement of the Viszla Breed, showing the versatility of the Viszla as a good looking, well mannered hunting dog.

CLUB PROCEDURE

(A) Any AKC recognized Viszla Club shall be eligible to conduct any or all of the Versatile Dog Tests provided the local club complies fully with all portions of the Procedures, Rules and Regulations as laid down by the Viszla Club of America, Inc.

(B) All Tests shall be witnessed by a member of the VCA who is approved by the Breed Improvement Committee of the VCA. This VCA member must be thoroughly familiar with the rules and regulations for all tests being conducted by the local club. This VCA member in conjunction with the Test Committee must be willing to vouch for the accuracy, honesty and compliance with the regulations and conduct of the tests.

(C) The Local Club shall appoint a Test Committee consisting of a Chairman, Secretary, Field Representative, Obedience Representative, and Conformation Representative who shall be knowledgeable in their area. The VCA member may be anyone of the committee. The Test Committee shall be responsible for the entire running of the tests and the selection of the judges.

(D) The Secretary of the Local Club desiring to conduct any or all of the Versatility Tests shall make written request to the BIC Chairman. This request must be received by the BIC Chairman at least ten (10) weeks prior to the first day of the proposed tests. Each request shall include:

1. Date or dates and approximate starting time of the event.
2. Exact location where the tests will be held.
3. Name of Judge for each test: One (1) for Field, one (1) for Obedience and one (1) for Conformation.
4. The kind of game birds to be used in the Field test.

6. Entries must be received by the Test Secretary by the date stated on the entry form.

7. Any or all tests may be held in conjunction with any local club activity or a special date may be set aside for conducting the tests.

8. Any or all tests may be held in conjunction with AKC events but must in no way interfere with the running of the AKC event and AKC permission must be obtained by the test giving club.

9. An entry fee may be charged by the test giving club, this fee shall include a two (2) dollar fee to be sent to the BIC Chairman along with the Judges sheets. Results shall not be recorded by the BIC until the two (2) dollar fee per dog per test is received.

10. The Field Test shall be conducted as in the judging of a Retrieving Derby Stake with each dog being evaluated separately and marked either PASS or FAIL.

11. The Obedience Test shall consist of four exercises. The handler must state prior to each exercise, where applicable, whether his/her dog will sit, stand or down and the dog will be scored accordingly. At least fifty per cent (50%) of each exercise must be completed in order to pass and the dog will be marked either PASS or FAIL on the Obedience Test in it's entirety.

12. The Conformation Test shall be conducted on the format of a regular show class with no placements made. The dogs must conform to the Viszla Standard and shall be measured using a wicket. The judge shall mark each entry PASS or FAIL.

13. The required information on each Viszla qualifying in a test must be recorded in duplicate on forms provided by the BIC. The original copy must be received by the BIC Chairman along with the two (2) dollar fee per dog per test within fourteen (14) days after completion of the test(s). The BIC shall review the results and issue appropriate certificates to eligible dogs. Upon receipt of a certificate the dog

5. Names and addresses of Test Chairman, Test Secretary, VCA member and the names of all members of the Committee.

ELIGIBILITY OF DOGS

1. Any AKC Registered Viszla who has reached the age of eighteen (18) months on the first advertised day of the tests may be entered in any or all of the tests offered.

2. No cryptorchid or monorchid Viszlas shall be eligible to enter any of the tests.

3. If the test giving club so desires bitches in season may take the tests. If bitches in season are accepted for these tests they must be tested after all other dogs have been tested.

RULES

1. The Versatility Program is a VCA event. Results of all tests shall be sent to the BIC Chairman who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors of the VCA.

2. All ratings are to be either PASS or FAIL and no rating is to be considered official until confirmed by the BIC. Aside from pass or fail judges may make comments and recommendations that may be helpful to the handler.

3. Applications to hold Versatility Tests, entry forms, and judging sheets will be issued by the BIC.

4. Entries must list the registered name of the Viszla, sex, AKC number whelping date, sire and dam, breeder, test(s) entered, name of handler, and name and address of owner.

5. Entry in the Field and Obedience Tests may be made as many times as necessary to fulfill certificate requirements. Entry of a dog in the Conformation Test shall be limited to three (3) failures, after the third failure in the Conformation Test a Viszla shall no longer be eligible to enter this test.

may use the following letters after it's name:

- F.D. - Field Dog Certificate.
- C.C. - Conformation Certificate.
- O.C. - Obedience Certificate.

14. In order to request issuance of a Versatility Certificate all Viszlas must pass all three (3) tests three (3) times under three (3) different judges. Upon successful completion of these requirements the Viszla's owner must apply to the BIC Chairman for the Versatility Certificate. Upon receipt of the Versatility Certificate the dog may use the letters V.C. after it's name.

15. A viszla will be eligible to receive a certificate for any of the tests upon proof of proper performance in each given area such as:

- (A) Photocopy of AKC Certificate of Championships in Field, Amateur Field, Conformation, Obedience or Obedience Titles, provided these requirements were completed after the Viszla reached the age of eighteen (18) months.
- (B) Photocopies of AKC GAZETTE pages showing dates and appropriate placements in three (3) Field Trial Retrieving stakes; three (3) Conformation wins (minimum five (5) Viszla defeated); three (3) qualifying scores in Obedience; or any combination of Test and above placements in each category totalling three (3) under three (3) different judges.
- (C) Any Viszla requesting a Conformation Certificate using A or B must submit to being measured to assure that the dog is within the height requirements for the Viszla breed. Measurement to be conducted by a Versatility Test Committee or a Test Judge.
- (D) A fee of three (3) dollars shall accompany requests for any certificates issued under A, B or C above.

16. The Viszla must be living as of the date any certificate is requested. No certificates will be issued posthumously.

17. Viszlas may compete for any or all of the certificates the ultimate goal being a Versatility Certificate.

CONFORMATION TEST - Any person in good standing with AKC and approved by the BIC. This Judge shall be chosen by the test giving club for his/her knowledge of the Vissla Standard and experience in the showing and/or judging of the Vissla.

FIELD TEST - Any person in good standing with AKC and approved by the BIC. This Judge shall be chosen by the test giving club for his/her knowledge of the AKC Field Trial Rules and Procedures as well as personal experience in field trials.

OBEDIENCE TEST - Any person in good standing with AKC and approved by the BIC. This Judge shall be chosen by the test giving club for his/her experience in the obedience ring.

FIELD TEST REQUIREMENTS

Each Vissla shall have a short backcourse of at least three (3) minutes and not more than five (5) minutes and at least five (5) minutes and not more than eight (8) minutes in a bird field (as set forth in the AKC Field Trial Rules) in which at least two (2) game birds have been planted.

To pass this test a Vissla must exhibit a natural desire to hunt, must locate and point a game bird and must retrieve the game bird in an acceptable Derby manner. The Vissla must show no signs of being gun shy and must show reasonable response to the handler's commands.

In the interest of safety, once the Vissla has established point the handler may, if he so desires, hold his dog by the collar and have the gunner flush and shoot the bird. There shall be no penalty for collaring the dog.

All gunning shall be done by an official gunner. Safety to people being of the utmost importance. If no birds are killed over the Vissla taking the test the Judge, at his/her own discretion, may have a dead game bird thrown out for a retrieve.

To pass the Conformation Test Visslas should conform to the Vissla Standard and shall be measured to assure that they are within the height requirements for the breed. The Judge is not attempting to determine whether a dog is of championship caliber but whether the dog reflects the qualities of a pure bred Vissla.

Conformation judging shall be guided by the following scale of points with sixty (60) required for a pass:

GENERAL APPEARANCE & TEMPERAMENT	25
Includes height, color and coat	
BODY	25
Includes neck, tail and musculing	
HEAD	25
Includes bite, eyes and ears	
RUNNING GEAR	25
Includes gait, legs and feet	

Points shall be deducted for specific faults and areas not conforming to the Standard. Visslas measuring more than two (2) inches over or under the height requirements for the Vissla breed shall automatically fail the Conformation Test. Lesser height deviations shall be faulted accordingly.

OBEDIENCE TEST REQUIREMENTS

Visslas taking this test must score at least fifty per cent (50%) in each of the following exercises:

1. HEEL FREE	40 points
2. STAND FOR EXAMINATION	30 points
3. RECALL	30 points
4. STAY EXERCISE	30 points

The entry shall be marked PASS or FAIL on the Obedience Test in it's entirety.

HEEL FREE - This exercise shall be executed on a simple "L" pattern. Orders and scoring shall be the same as written in the AKC Novice Obedience Regulations with the exception of the sit at the handler's halt which is optional. In place of the sit the dog may stand at the handler's left side. The handler must state prior to the exercise whether the dog will sit or stand and will be scored accordingly. There will be no Figure Eight exercise.

STAND FOR EXAMINATION - Orders are "Stand your dog and leave when ready", "Back to your dog", and "Exercise finished". There will be no further command from the Judge to the handler to leave the dog. On the Judge's order the handler will stand the dog by the method of his choice taking any reasonable time. The handler will then give the command and/or signal to stay and walk forward approximately six (6) feet, turn and face the dog. The Judge will then approach the dog, examine it briefly and return to his original position. The Judge will then order "Back to your dog", the handler will walk around behind the dog and return to the heel position. The Judge then gives the command "Exercise finished". Scoring shall be the same as written in the AKC Novice Obedience rules.

RECALL - Orders and scoring shall be the same as written in the AKC Novice Obedience Regulations with the exception that the dog may be left sitting or standing and upon recall may stand or sit to the front or side and within reach of the handler. The handler must state prior to the exercise whether the dog will stand or sit and will be scored accordingly. The exercise will be considered complete when the dog recalls to the handler.

STAY EXERCISE - This exercise shall be performed as a group exercise, orders and scoring shall be the same as written for the AKC Novice Group Exercise with the exception that a minimum of three (3) dogs shall be required and that the dog may be left in a sit, stand or down position as desired by the handler. The dog's position must be stated prior to the exercise and the dog must remain in the position as commanded by it's handler. The dog will be scored accordingly. This exercise shall be for three (3) minutes.
