Historically the April GAZETTE contains the final trial results for the preceding year. That means that the top ten lists in this issue of the VIZSLA FIELD are the Finals for the 1985 calendar year. Congratulations to Sam's Star Buck and Rebel Rouser Smokey's Bandit for topping the Open list and Amateur list respectively. Each of these dogs will receive the framed VIZSLA FIELD Certificate of Achievement shortly.

One of the questions you can ask yourself is whether the Top Ten lists accurately reflect quality work by Vizslas in the field. I think so. The four Vizslas that placed in the National Open Championship are ranked in the top six on the Open list. Even if you took away the points they earned in the Championship, Star Buck would remain #1 and the other three would remain on the list. The two Vizslas that placed in the Amateur Championship would also retain their Top Ten status near the top of the Amateur list if the points earned in the Amateur Championship were subtracted. Once again, congratulations to these two splendid Vizslas.

In case you didn't notice, J.R. is not both #8 and #9 on the Amateur list. Rivendell Reagan should have had the #9 slot. Of the twenty different Vizslas listed, eight are from the Class of '82, ie either were in or eligible to be in the 1982 National Derby stake. Those dogs are Sandman, Selkie, Askim, Smokey's Bandit, Reckless, J.R., Reagan, and Staunch Standish. That's more than 1/3 of the top ten Vizslas. Also, there are 10 more from that Derby stake of 28 who have Gun Dog placements, and are zeroing in on their field titles. "It was a very good year!"

Not too many years ago pheasants were cheap and were the bird most used at field trials. Pheasant^s have a tendency to run when released and to keep running until they were no longer useful for the trial that released them. When they flew, they flew away - far away. By removing themselves from the area where the dog was hunting, the temptation to go after it was reduced. In the fall when the cover was heavy and the temperatures were up, if five dogs in a twenty dog stake had birds (whether handled successfully or not) it was a successful stake. In the spring when temperatures were down and cover was thin, half of the dogs usually found birds. Today quail are used for trials and the game has changed. Multiple finds by almost every dog spring and fall is derigueur. The birds don't fly off. Sometimes we are lucky if we can get the bird to fly at all. The temptation for the dog to go for a retrieve is much greater and is repeated over and over on course. The field trial fraternity has responded to these changes caused by switching to cheaper birds by changing the rules of the game. It is euphemistically called "improving the rules." When finds were few and far between on course, establishing a back was necessary to be placed either 1st or 2nd. If it did not occur on course, a backing situation was set up in a callback. More often than not, the Back was completed by the handler walking out with the dog at heel. The handler would order "stay" and step away from the dog. The bird was then flushed. The "backing" dog had to remain motionless throughout. If it were a retrieving stake and one dog needed a retrieve and another a back, frequently both dogs were called back to fulfill their requirements simultaneously. Call backs sometimes took a long time to complete. The fraternity responded and eliminated backing as a requirement for placement (1st or 2nd). They added that universally ignored phrase to the rules that is supposed to severely penalize any avoidance of the backing situation.

Since the birds don't fly off and heeling away from bird work has become tougher, Irish Setters, Brittanys, and Weimariners have allowed the handler to collar the dog for the purpose of leading him away from the site of a find.

Water retrieving was a part of the requirements for becoming a Field Champion for several breeds. Vizslas never had to do that. It was removed at the time that a prominent Vizsla was afraid to swim and his owner exercised enough clout to keep the VCA from joining in the Water Retrieve requirement.

Retrieving as a part of earning the Field Champion title is not a part of the Irish Setter or Brittany requirements. It has been the object of much discussion lately as to whether it is necessary for other breeds as well.

Where are we now. Back-out. Water retrieve-out. Heel away from bird work-out. Retrieve-out. Steady to wing & shot? A quick grab when collaring de-emphasizes the steady to wing and shot does it not? Come when called - out (the scout goes to bring the dog back - not the way it's supposed to be, but is). What is left? Run, find bird, point! Right. Not really. Finding multiple birds lessens your chance of winning because that is the only place left where an error can occur. Run - blink birds everywhere except near the handler, then point (frequently with his help - whoa - CAREFUL - whup, whup, etc). More than one stake is won by a run like hell, birdless back course and a call back for the find with the handler on foot-whup, whup, whupping all the way to the planted bird.

I have just described a "phoney baloney!" Remember that phrase as you ride along and watch the dogs. Real bird dogs are still on the trial circuit and still enter the winner's circle. Phoney baloneys are out there in ever increasing numbers and entering the winner's circle more and more often. If there are birds in the cover and multiple finds are carded regularly by some of the entrants, then those dogs that cover lots of ground but only manage to point (find) birds within 50 yards of their handler are not hunting once they open up some space between themselves and their handler.

The rules have been inexorably changed to de-emphasize those skills necessary to put dinner on the table. And yet, the vast majority of people who buy a Vizsla and who intend to usefully work with it are HUNTERS who are counting on those very skills being there.

The weather started the weekend in the teens and worked its way up to the 60's. Multiple finds in the gun dog events on short flying quail made impeccable bird work scarce. While they had four placeable dogs in the Amateur Gun Dog, the judges withheld first place citing less than perfect manners as the reason. Deb Fridlund, whose dog Dickens placed 3rd in the Open, was approached by both judges after the Amateur placements were given and was assured that it was her three points that remained unclaimed. Evidently Dickens' manners on his first three finds were crisp enough that the judges felt that any winner had to exhibit the same crispness. Dickens 4th find, halfway around the course on a dead bird, was his undoing. Deb said the retrieve was flawless and to hand.

Scooter's "blue" in the Open completed his retrieving points needed for his Field Championship. Bobby and Scooter now need only that, oft times tough to get, Open major.

Ken Crago cracked the winner's circle with three placements on three different dogs, including one "blue" on Sauce in the Puppy stake. Ken brought Sauce back from Arizona where he left Brandy to be bred to the winner of the Rio Salado Hunting Dog Stake (non-regular). Ken spent the last month touting Sauce to all who would listen. I think that even he was surprised when she took the Puppy stake though.

Tony Lucas's hot young prospect came through with a "blue" in the Derby and "red" in the Puppy. Budman, you will recall, was runner-up in the VCOI 31 dog Hunting Dog stake (Des Plaines Hunting Dog Championship) just two weeks earlier. Just found out that Budman took a Derby 2nd at the GSP trial the weekend of the 15 & 16th of March. Look out!!!

If you look at the names of the handlers of the winners, you will see that, once again, those with experience claimed the prizes. Our sport definitely rewards long term commitment.

We ran 79 dogs. Del Seelye would have sent some if we would have had the room. Hank Rozanek had a judging assignment and was not there. The March 8-9 date was two weeks earlier than the previous two years. This was caused by shifting numbers of March weekends. We must be more careful in the future when moving dates. People make plans long in advance and frequently cannot attend when dates are changed. We had five other breed entries. We did not need them. With a slight change in the premium wording, we would have been able to accommodate all Vizslas who wished to enter. It has been years since the numbers of entries was such that an all Vizsla trial could use simultaneous courses.

All in all, Harry Ruffner, Chairman, and his committee did a great job in producing another class Vizsla Club of Illinois field trial. See you in the fall.

Thank you to the committee members that worked and the non-committee members who did cleanup, etc. All those jobs keep a trial together and moving along. Our hunting dog stake was a big success thanks to Bill Lyman and John Steenberg for judging. They made sure everyone got their share of the birds. A BIG trophy is awarded for 1st place. The winners are expected to take their turn judging. How about it Jim?
