On the seriously injured list is Woehrles' Windjammer Jody, owner Geno Woehrle. "Jodi" is a promising young gun dog who had some good showings in the fall field trials. We are sorry to hear Norm Killians' "Sugar" is seriously ill.."Sugar" has been a top contender in Shoot-to-Retrieve trials. Upstairs-Downstairs, Eastern Iowan Bob Freyeruth, who is always working & doing, can tell the most interesting stories about things he has done in his lifetime..It seems the other day Bob was up in his barn and managed to fall down off the ladder breaking his leg. Most people would have called it a day but Bob just readjusted his leg (it was turned sideways) and went on with his chores til afternoon.....The Vizsla Club of Il.,Inc. celebrated "17 Glorious Years" at our Nov. 19th meeting. The club was organized in 1963 to bring together fellow Vizsla owners in sportsmanlike competition and educational purposes. The VCI sponsored it's first AKC trial Sept.12th,'65, first Show June,'72. We were the first club to hold a Open Limited G.D. stake in AKC. history..The club has seen many people come and many go, in the process,alot of lasting friendships have been made. Four charter members are still active; Iris Pechota, Joe and Helen Malicek and Betty Solberg....

ON THE COVER:

DCH.,APC. AMBER'S WINDY AUTUMN was unanimously voted in as 1980 VCOI, Inc. Hall of Fame dog. "Windy" is owned by Phil & Dorothy Rosenberg, past Pres. and very active members. They now reside in Houston, TX. Phil handled "Windy" throughout her career. At the time "Windy" finished as a field ch., she was the youngest Vizsla to finish in the field and she was the first Vizsla AFCH. recorded with AKC.

In her first year of gun dog competition, she was entered in 17 field trials and placed 17 times, with 8 blue ribbons, against all-breed competition. "Windy" continued on to rack up 44 placements and 14 firsts. At the VCOA Nationals, she won the Open Gun Dog stake in 1970, the Open Gun Dog and the Amateur Gun Dog in the spring of 1971, the Amateur Gun Dog in the fall of '71, '72 and she won the Open Limited Gun Dog in Colorado the spring of '73. Total 6 Natl. Gun Dog stakes. Her last win was at the Fox Valley GSD-Club of Wisc. for a 5 pt. major in the Amateur Gun Dog stake.

"Windy's" other achievements were OHJO DOG OF THE YEAR 1972, the only dog in VCI history to win the DOG OF THE DAY award 3 times, offspring-CH. Bowcots' Gamster, FCH. Windy Duke's Rex, FCH. Windy's Rebel Knight, DCH. WD Regina, Pipers Windy April, who took a 2nd in the field futurity, won the puppy stake and took a 2nd in the Derby in Calif. at the Natls. These are just the ones I am familiar with.

"Windy" was born Feb. 28, 1968. She was #3 dog on the top/ten beat out by her Mom & Dad, DCH. & APC. Brook's Amber Mist & FCH. & APC. Jodi of Czuki Barat. "Windy" was #2 in 1970. When you think of "Windy" you think of class.....

IF YOU WANT TO NOMINATE A DOG FOR THE 1981 HALL OF FAME, FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS BELOW AND BEGIN NOW.

If more information is needed, I will contact you after the Letter of Nomination arrives.

HALL OF FAME - DOGS (VIZSLAS) not more than two annually.

Requirements:

1. A VIZSLA
2. Deemed to have made a significant contribution to the Vizsla breed.
3. Must be deceased two years prior to nomination.
4. Registered with the AKC.

Election Procedure:

1. Send Letters of Nomination to Chairman, J. Busch, R.R.#1, Poplar Grove, Ill. 61065.
2. Letters must arrive during the months of January, February, and March. A check for \$5.00 must accompany the Letter of Nomination.
3. Letter of Nomination must include the following:
 - a. dog's full AKC name including all titles
 - b. AKC number
 - c. date of birth, date of death
 - d. breeder's name
 - e. three generation pedigree (parents, grandparents & great-grandparents)
 - f. owner's name and current address
 - g. history of accomplishments and/or contributions to the breed
 - h. 100 word summary of "a through g" to be sent out with the ballot
4. In April the Chairman makes copies of the Letters of Nomination and distributes them to the other committee members who mark them "YES" or "NO" and return them to the Chairman by April 30th.
5. The Chairman will prepare a ballot listing the nominated dogs with three "YES" votes in alphabetical order. Such ballot shall include the 1-0 word summary mentioned in 3h. The Chairman will send the ballot to the Secretary of the VCA so that it may be mailed at the same time as the ballots for the general election.
6. Each member of the VCA shall then vote for two dogs and return the Hall of Fame ballot to the accountancy.
7. The timetable for the general election shall also apply to the Hall of Fame election, i.e.,
 - a. on or before July 1, ballots shall be mailed
 - b. ballots must be mailed and received by the accountancy before Aug. 1st.
 - c. the accountancy will count the votes and report the results to the Chairman.
8. If there is a tie, it will be broken by a vote of the three members of the Hall of Fame committee.
9. The VIZSLA NEWS editor will publish the names of the winners in the VIZSLA NEWS as soon as possible.
10. The Committee Chairman will prepare the Hall of Fame scrolls for presentation to the owners at the banquet prior to the general membership meeting at the Nationals.
11. It is the responsibility of the Hall of Fame Chairman to contact the owners and make arrangements to have them or their representative present to receive their scroll.

Two studs account for a total of 11 of the 30 Vizslas on the Honor Roll. Rebel Rouser Bandieto has six on the Honor Roll out of five different bitches. DC Sir Amber Sam accounts for five on the Honor Roll out of two different bitches. Individual achievement plus the ability to pass on those traits is the mark of greatness. These two dogs have met both of these criteria.

Rebel Rouser Bandieto started early in the winner's circle. At the tender age of 10 months he won the Puppy and the Derby at the Nationals. He was almost unbeatable as a young dog. The entire Vizsla world waited breathlessly as he made the transition from Derby to Gun Dog. Then illness struck. Word went out that Bandieto was dying. Finally, we all knew that he had had a lung removed. Cedar Fungus was the problem. A real freak sickness, but the dog's life was spared. Never would he compete as a gun dog, but he could still produce pups, and produce he has. Out of a great variety of bitches he has produced a great number of puppy/derby winners.

DC Sir Amber Sam came from the greatest litter that has ever been born. There were eight pups in the litter by DC & AFC Sir Lancelot and DC & AFC Brook's Amber Mist. Seven of those pups had field placements. Five of them became bench champions (one finished in three consecutive shows - 8 days). The pups from that litter went 1-2-3-4 in the field futurity in which they competed. Sam is now the second pup from that litter to become a Vizsla National Field Champion. Both of the National Field Champions are Dual Champions and Amateur Field Champions. Sam also has produced a variety of Puppy/Derby winners out of a variety of bitches.

Just think...one third of all the Vizslas on the current list of Puppy/Derby winners have been sired by these two dogs. Remarkable! Especially when you consider that of the 16 Vizsla males on the Top Ten Open and Top Ten Amateur Gun Dog lists, only three currently have a Puppy/Derby offspring winner listed in the Honor Roll.

I have watched this National Event evolve over the past year. Although planned by a relatively small number of people, the end result was a super event. Most field trialers were very happy with the facilities, and we saw many excellent performances. The Derby Stake was labeled "Outstanding" by many. Even the Arizona weather cooperated and cool breezes, bright sunny days and blue skies provided a backdrop for the desert vegetation - a new visual adventure for many VCA members. Home-cooked food served up by Paul Saxe on the grounds provided an extra special touch, and the steak fry on Wednesday night warmed everyone as the desert temperatures dropped after the sun set.

A hospitality room at the motel headquarters served as a focal point for members. Club materials were available, trophies displayed, opinions exchanged, and general information and help given so graciously by California VCA members Rod and Margaret Wilson who acted as hosts for the entire week.

The motel staff was pleasant and helpful, and VCA members are to be applauded for keeping the facilities clean.

As usual, the Board meeting lasted all day and well into the evening. After officer and committee reports, many important items were discussed and resolved. Among the agenda items were the adoption of a Versatility Certificate; definition of a Vizsla Judge; Adoption of the Vizsla Standard Revision; Future Pedigree Books; a National Specialty format; Amendments to the Hall of Fame Committee, and many more topics too numerous to mention. The 1981 Nominating Committee was chosen and is composed of Lynn Worth, Ken Crago and Ed Wanjan.

The banquet and general membership meeting was held Thursday evening. Over 200 members attended. President Al Lucas presided and prior to the business meeting on behalf of the VCA, he awarded a plaque to Bob Costa recognizing the achievements of his Dual Champion Carlad's Kutya Kai Costa, UD, as the first Tri Champion (of any breed) recognized by the A.K.C. Bob received a standing ovation for this outstanding accomplishment.

After the induction of Hall of Fame winners Ch. Csincs V Hunt, CIX, and Field Champion Weedy Creek Dutches, the General Membership meeting began. Highlights of the Board meeting were presented, and several subjects were discussed and points clarified. When there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
