We need to update our Certified Hunting Dog award plaque. We have 84 names to add. Kathy Harmer and Randy Boggs volunteered to check out prices for engraving.

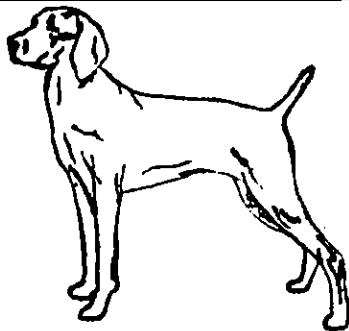
Tony Lucas motioned, seconded by Bill Elliott, to adjourn at 9:50pm.

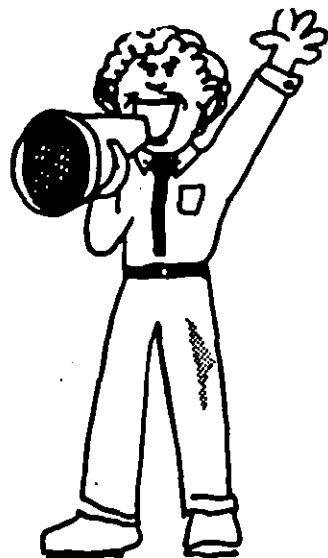

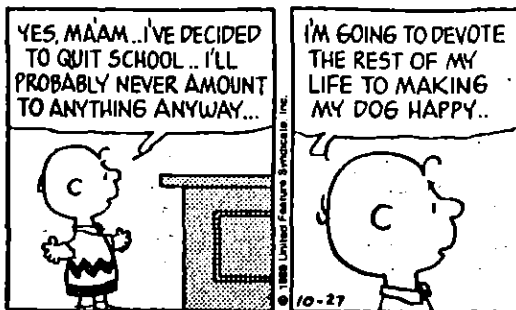
ON THE COVER

The month of May marked the conclusion of the Spring field trial season for most triers. Our Illinois Club as a group had about the most significant impact on field trial results of any Vizsla Specialty Club. I can't recall a single weekend this Spring in which an Illinois Vizsla failed to win or place in a field trial. Our members competed in both the closed trials and the open all breed types of trials and placed in all. For what's been called "a bunch of amateurs", we've done a very long way. June 1, 1975 marked the date of our annual VCOI Specialty Show. This 6th Annual Specialty was very typical of our past shows in that between 25-30 Vizslas were entered. 23 Vizslas including 12 Specials were entered this year. The VCOI Specialty was part of the Stone City All Breed Show held at the Westminster Park Race Track. Mr. Raymond Martin was our Judge and put thought and effort into the placements. Whether observers agreed or disagreed with Judge Martin's placements, none can say that any entrant was ignored in the ring. At the conclusion of the Specialty I thanked Mr. Martin for his efforts in our behalf.

Want to give your dog a special holiday treat? Try this Dog Biscuit recipe for stocking stuffers! I have one friend who sends them to her friends' dogs at Christmas. Just don't decorate the tree with them - I think they're too tempting for that!

DOG BISCUIT MASTER RECIPE

10 BISCUITS

2 1/2 C whole wheat flour	1/2 C powdered dry milk
1/2 tsp each salt, garlic powder	1 egg, beaten
1 tsp brown sugar	1/2 C ice water
6 Tbsp margarine, shortening or meat drippings	

Pre-heat oven to 350°. Combine flour, dry milk, salt, garlic powder and brown sugar. Cut in shortening until mix resembles corn meal. Mix in egg. Add enough water so that mixture forms a ball.

Pat out dough 1/2" thick with fingers on a lightly oiled cookie sheet. Cut with doggie biscuit cutter and remove scraps. Pat out scraps and proceed as before. Bake 25-30 mins. Remove and cool on cake rack.

Variations: add one of the following to vary flavor:

- 1 C pureed cooked green vegetables or carrots
- 6 Tbsp whole wheat or rye kernels
- 3-5 Tbsp liver powder (available at health food stores)

Mix in the ingredient of your choice with egg

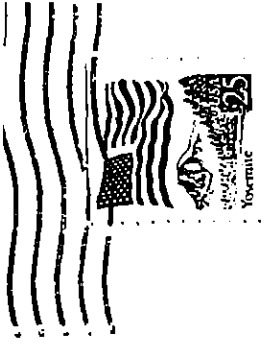
