Following are the placements for the Vizsla Club of
Illinois, Inc. Fall Field Trial which was held at the
DesPlaines Wildlife Area, Joliet, Ill. on Nov. 6-7-71.

I am proud to report that our Illinois Vizslas won 1st place in 4 of the 5 stakes. In fact, 7 of the 18 placements awarded went to VCOI Vizslas. These results are significant when you consider that this trial was open to Vizslas, German Short Haired Pointers, German Virchaired Pointers, Brittany Spaniels, Weimaraners, Irish Setters, and Gordon Setters. There was a total of 74 starters out of an entry of 76 dogs. In Vern Innman and Darrell Gaynor were our judges-for all stakes.

Trixie, who raced for help and brought rescuers to her two year old master. Richard Sherry, when he was drowning in icy water, is winner of the Ken-Ration gold medal award as "America's Dog Hero of the year" for 1971

owned by the Sherry family, of Lynn, Mass., Trixie is a mixed breed bitch, described as "part Beagle", and is only the fourth dog of mixed breeding in the 18 year distory of the event to capture the nations top award for dog heroism.

On a morning this past April, little Ricky somehow

managed to elude his grandmother, in whose care he had been left while his father & mother were at work. and squirm through a tiny space in the fence of the back yard of his home. His absence quickly discovered his grandmother and a next door neighbor, went in. search of the child. Only a few steps from her home, Trixie, soaking wet and barking furiously, rushed up to Mrs Manna, (the neighbor) then raced away, looking over her shoulder as dogs do when they wish to be followed. Mrs. Manna hurried behind her to Buchanan Bridge Pond, about 100 yards from the Sherry home. Halting at the waters edge, Trixie continued barking and looking at Mrs. Manna who peered into the pond but could see nothing. Trixic leaped into the 35 degree water, began swimming in a small circle-still barking Mrs. Manna, looking where Trixie swam, thought she saw the edge of Ricky's jacket; she jumped into the pond where the dog was continuing her frantic signals- and brought kicky out.

Firemen, responding quickly to the distress call, could find no sign of life in the youngster, although "unbelievable quantities of water" were forced from his lungs by artificial respiration. Rushed to Lynn hospital, a team of Doctors worked desperately to save him. By noon the next day his temperature was back to normal; a week later his , parents were permitted to take him home, where a delighted Trixie barked a wild and joyful welcome.

At the Warwick Hotel, Houstan, Texas, on Sept. 9th, Trixie was acclaimed at a dinner in her honor: She received the gold medal, a gold-plated lead & collar, a gold plaque, custom made dog-blanket, and a years supply of dog food. Her Owners Recieved A \$1,000 U.S. Bond. U.S. Bond.
