# THE "Juggernaut" Rolls Again

The "Juggernaut" is a term that I coined some years ago to refer to the VCOI field trialers. As a group, we dominated the placements at most field trials that the group attended. We were not humble about our successes and took some flack about our prideful superiority. Well, the "Juggernaut" drew together and rose up once again to romp and stomp at the recently completed VCA National Championship in Ohio.

VCOI members took 1st and 2nd in the Open Championship. Out-of-state member, Jack Sharkey, was 1st with Hodag's Hunter and Illinois own Chuck Boegel took 2nd with Rebel Rouser Rex IV (Hank Rozanek, handling - also a VCOI member).

VCOI members took 1st and 2nd and 4th in the Amateur Championship. Out-of-state member, Al Lucas, was 1st with EK's Tripper. Illinois owner Tony Ordonez was 2nd with Reckless Ballofire, and Illinois' own Denny Keeton was 4th with Linden's Little Jessie.

In the National Derby Classic, Illinois' own Jim Gingrich took 1st with Bo Knows Birds (Bo, by the way, is currently #1 on the VCA Puppy/Derby Top Ten and when his Derby career is over, he will have set a new record for top ten points earned, eclipsing the old record set by out-of-state VCOI member Al Lucas' Semper Fi Montezuma) Second place was won by out-of-state member George Noren's Lakeside Sunny Girl Selle (Hank Rozanek handling-VCOI member). Fourth in the Derby Classic was won by Al Lucas' Semper Fi Gust O Wind.

## FROM THE PRESIDENT

**FUTURITY UPDATE** 

The book is almost closed on the renominations for the 1994 Futurity. There is one litter from which renominations can still come in. I know of two dogs out of that litter that will probably enter. That will make 19 Vizslas eligible to enter the 1994 Futurity. I am predicting that approximately 15 Vizslas will go to the line on March 4th. Once again, the winner will receive the double Lane dog trophy, and the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd runner-ups will receive the single Lane dog trophy.

The 1995 Futurity promises to be the biggest Futurity ever. We already have 21 litters nominated and I know of several more born that most certainly will enter. I am predicting that at least 30 Vizslas will start in 1005

1995. If you know of a litter that could be nominated for the Futurity, speak to the breeder and encourage them to enter. If you can't think of what to say, at least tell them to call me for more information about the Futurity.

In the recently completed Nationals, there were 27 entries in the Derby. Of those 27, fifteen were Futurity eligible or entered dogs. That's great considering that most of the others were from litters born far far from the Midwest. We would like to get these litters entered also, but it probably won't happen except occasionally.

As Illinois Vizsla Breeder Referral, I speak to prospective Vizsla owners. I am asked a couple of questions frequently.

#### Nutrition

I suggest that all dogs owners feed a premium quality dry dog food. NO SUPPLEMENTS ARE NECESSARY. Table scraps, ie: bones, trimmed fat and other food unfit for human consumption, are prohibited. Leftovers are allowed in limited quantity. Our dogs never get protein leftovers, but love leftover green beans pasta and carrots.

We feed Purina Pro Plan, and have fed IAMS and ANF with equally good results. Waynes and Science Diet are other examples... Ask other owners what they feed, and where they get it. Call around for prices, I have found as much as a \$6.00 differential on a 40 pound bag.

We purchase food at a feed store, but some of the grocery stores are good. Read labels, meat based protein is better quality than soy protein. Stay away from kibble that contains color. Dogs are color blind and some allergies have been traced to yellow and red dye. Less expensive brands may not be a bargain if you need to feed more.

Puppies need puppy food until 12-18 months. The brand we feed is 27% protein and 18% fat. Feed three discrete meals, giving no more food than the puppy can finish in 15 minutes. Don't overfeed. Drop a meal after 6 months. Our vet suggests that all dogs get two meals a day. When you switch foods, do so slowly to avoid stomach upset. It may take 10 pounds of food to change over.

#### Crates

Housebreaking is easier with a crate. Dogs are a den animal. As soon as a young pup is able to learn, his mother teaches him to void outside of the den. A crate provides a

puppy with an artificial den. A safe harbor. The use of a cage will have a positive effect on your puppy. He will never learn destructive behavior. They learn instead to lie quietly while you are gone. A crate will allow your dog to take his own room where ever you travel.

Some owners suggest a wire cage. A cage allows unlimited circulation, some designs allow easy setup and compact folding, and many can be purchased with a divider that can be moved as the puppy grows. Debi Schwartz reminded me that one of the best reasons for buying a wire cage is visibility. Use of a wire cage in a station wagon or small pickup allows the driver to look out the back window. The down side is price. Travel-Aire makes a wire cage that folds, and is approved for airline travel. The cage itself (24"wX36" dX28"h) retails for \$139.99, the pan is an additional \$24.99 and the airline kit \$109.99. (The airline kit includes a waterproof canvas cover.) For \$274.97 you are ready to fly.

We use airline approved plastic crates. We use a medium size (20"wX27"dX19"h) one until the puppy is 4-5 months old. With our first few puppies, we borrowed one from a Shih Tzu owner. With our adult dogs we use a large Vari-Kennel. (24"wX36"dX26") Retail \$129.00.

The plastic crates are easy to clean, lightweight and can easily be assembled without tools. In hot weather the ventilated top can be used for the bottom for extra air flow.

Each dog needs it's own space. We keep a large crate in the house for each dog. It serves as a safe harbor when they need to be away from the family or each other. We use the intermediate Vari-Kennel for travel.


