Please note: Sark Papparigian of Cal. has three dogs in the top ten at the same time, (1 Gun Dog and two Pappy/Derbys). Congratulations. Also, please note, Paul Holzworth of Iowa has two dogs on the top ten gun dog list. Paul just finished Pride of Holzworth Farm as a F.Ch. and that makes Paul's 3rd. Vizsla with a field title and 4th Vizsla to be on the top ten AA/GD list) Paul is an amateur and as far as I know has done it without major professional help. I do not know of any other amateur who has finished 3 Vizslas in the field. Congratulations to Dr. Paul Holzworth of Des Moines, Iowa, King of the Amateur Vizslas Handlers.

Richard Hurt of Md (Pilgrims Pride) wrote me a long letter re top ten and other things. He asked me if I knew how many top ten Vizslas Puppy/Derby went on to be successful All Age/Gun Dogs. I didn't then, but I do now. Up to the May 1978 Gazette, from the time Phil Started in 1971, 116 Vizslas have had their name mentioned on the Puppy/Derby top ten list. Some of these dogs have been mentioned month after month, and some have only been mentioned one time. Out of those 116 Vizslas 26 went on to become Top Ten Gun Dogs. Out of these 26 Vizslas, 16 also became field champions. There are 2 Vizslas that made the top ten as Puppy/Derbies, later became field champions, but have not appeared on the top ten All Age/Gun Dog list. There have been 73 Vizslas mentioned on the Top Ten All Age/Gun Dog list in the years since it began. Out of these 73 Vizslas, 41 hold field champion or Amateur F.Ch. titles. Bear in mind that some of the dogs that appeared on the top ten gun dog list could not have appeared on the P/D list because it was not computed when they were young. Also, some of the Vizslas who have left

the P/D list recently are closing in on their field titles, but not yet earned them. Cliff Boggs mentioned in a recent article that he wrote for the Miami Valley news that Approx. 20,000 Vizslas have been registered with the AKC in the last ten years. He also mentions that it appears that approx. 12,000 Vizslas have been born but not registered. That makes approx. 32,000 in then years or 3,200 a year. The top ten has been reported for 7 years or 22,400 Vizsla births. Lumping the P/D and AA/GD top ten together, 163 Vizslas have been mentioned or 0.73% (3/4 of 1%) of the Vizsla population. This is the cream. The 41 Vizslas with field titles who made the top ten AA/GD list represents .18% (less than 1/5 of 1%) of the Vizsla population. This is the Cream of the Cream..

And, if that is the cream of the cream, what then are the 10* viable Dual champion who have appeared on the top ten AA/GD list.

HOT WEATHER HINTS FOR YOUR DOG

Give your dog plenty of cool water; change it often. Don't chain him out in the yard where he can't escape to shade.

ABOVE ALL, never lock him in a car parked in the sun. You may have put the car in the shade originally, but if your're gone a while, the sun may creep up on the car. Safter to leave him home. If your dog is struck with heat exhaustion, sponge him immediately with cool water, cover with a wet cloth and rush to vet if he does not improve, at once. Exercise him in the cool of the morning before the sun gets hot, and in the evening when it sets. Sponging him with water before exercise especially the head is helpful.

WHEN A DOG'S LOST, act immediately

My six year old Vizsla was put in our fenced yard on Christmas day, 1977; That was the last time we have seen him. In frustrating months to follow we tapped every dog finding source possible. Listed here are fruits of my experience.

People's Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) is interested in helping owners of lost dogs. The following information has been compiled for us.

"Take three good color photos of the dog, one from each side, and a top view- Write down a complete description: breed, sex, date of birth, coloring, height and weight. Up-date the file whenever your dog receives any conspicuous scars or marks

Make an emergency phone list of dog pound, police, local vets, humane or local animal rescue organizations, and the lost and found classified section of your local newspaper.

If your dog is lost--Dogs are usually held only 3-5 days. Act. IMMEDIATELY. Ask milk man, mail man and workers in your area to keep an eye out. Call local police dog pound, and animal shelters. Leave your written description and photos with all contacts. Best of all visit pound in person.

I suggest you also have your dog tattooed. This can be done at the Vizsla Club of Illinois club meetings (contact Tony Lucas) or most all dog groomers have the equipment. Put a large sign in your front window "dog lost, date, phone number". Be prepared to offer a reward and use the major Chicago news papers along with your local for advertising. Call the vets in your area and ask them to watch for strays matching your dogs' description. Don't forget the local bulletin board in your grocery, laundramat, and other public places. Do the same at your local schools and play yards. Check the Rabies department which also picks up in unincorporated areas. BE PERSISTENT! Contact your dog club publications and ask that they print a blurb on your dog.

Animal Welfare League 219-931-2507, St. Francis Pet Line.

Check the lost and found column for lost dogs that could answer the description of yours. Call those people leave your name and description of your dog, they may just get a lead on your dog while trying to find their own lost animal.

Good luck! And may you never need any of these services.

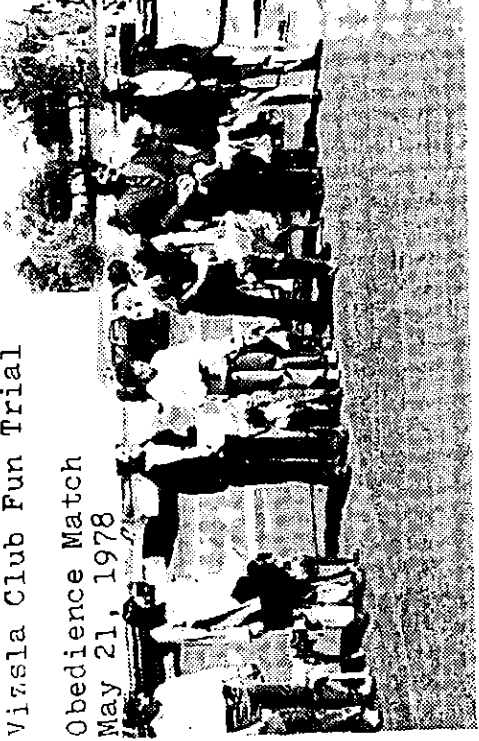

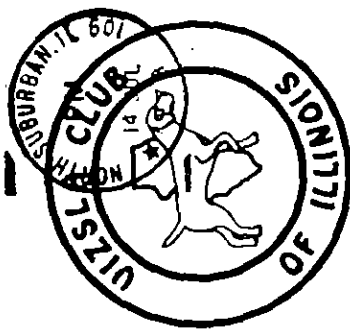
