MEETING MINUTES

Iris expressed concern over the costs of birds for the trials and the balance in the treasury. Discussion followed.

Kathy Harmer reported on the Specialty Show. We show at 10:05AM in Ring 8. There are more than 40 entries. Linda Busch will bring the table, Kathy will bring the flowers. Members are staking out the picnic area. Everyone is asked to bring two dishes to pass if they can. Jim and Linda Busch brought us up to date on the Fun Trial and party. Everything is all set. Gwen Tomlinson suggested that due to the treasury balance we not have a free fun trial. Tony Lucas motioned that we cut down on the number of birds ordered. Lois Greffin seconded. Randy Boggs will contact Guy Carnegie regarding the birds. Ken Crago motioned that we charge \$5 at the Fun Trial. seconded by Bill Elliot.


Jim Busch mentioned that Judges for the fall trial are Lynn and Bill Hadlock, Ed Cooney and Hugo Kosmel. Stakes are restricted to Vizslas only. Geno Woehrle said that everything is looking good for the Nationals. Volunteers are needed for line and gallery marshals, as three are needed for each brace. Rose Crago also mentioned that volunteers are needed to staff the hospitality room.

Roy Greffin read a survey from the Field Trial Clubs of Illinois soliciting opinions regarding the proposed increase in fees for wildlife area usage. Discussion followed. Randy Boggs motioned, seconded by Tony Ordonez, that we would like it to stay at \$35. Passed by a voice vote. Iris Pechota relayed a message from Chris Gaulke that their dog Major is the proud father of a litter of 4 males and 3 females.

Gwen Tomlinson suggested we discuss raising membership dues. Discussion followed. The general opinion was that \$10 for a single membership and \$15 for family membership would be more in line with other clubs, and would help

to cover the cost of the newsletter. The majority wanted to table this until the next meeting and vote on it at that time. Jack and Renee Izard volunteered refreshments for the next meeting.

Lois Greffin motioned, Sharon Schroader seconded, For adjournment. Motion carried at 10:30PM.

1987 NATIONAL EVENTS!

Wrapping up our three-part series on the Nationals, this article focuses on the National Championship Gun Dog stakes which will be held at DesPlaines Wildlife Area as part of the week-long National Events (Oct. 18-24).

THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP STAKE is open to Vizslas six months of age or older who have placed in an Open or Amateur All-Age Stake in an AKC licensed Trial, or who have placed first, second or third in an Open Gun Dog, Amateur Gun Dog, Open Limited Gun Dog, or Amateur Limited Gun Dog stake in which at least 13 dogs started in an AKC licensed Field Trial.

THE NATIONAL AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP STAKE is open to Vizslas six months of age or older who have placed first, second, third or fourth in an Amateur All-Age, Amateur Limited All-Age, Amateur Gun Dog, or Amateur Limited Gun Dog Stake in an AKC licensed Field Trial.

The performance standard for the Gun Dog stakes is outlined in the AKC Rules and Procedures book as "...A Gun Dog must give a finished performance and must be under its handler's control at all times. handle kindly, with a minimum of noise and hacking by the handler. A Gun Dog must show a keen desire to hunt, must have a bold and attractive style of running, and must demonstrate not only intelligence in quartering and in seeking objectives but also the ability to find game. The dog must hunt for its handler at all times at a range suitable for a handler on foot, and should show or check in front of its handler frequently. It must cover adequate ground but never range out of sight for a length of time that would detract from its usefulness as a practical hunting dog. The dog must locate game, must point staunchly, and must be steady to wing and shot. Intelligent use of the wind and terrain in locating game, accurate nose, and style and intensity on point, are essential. At least 30 minutes shall be allowed for each heat...

A dog encountering its brace mate on point must honor. Failure of a dog to honor when it sees its brace mate on point must be heavily penalized, and the intentional avoidance by a dog or handler of a backing situation

must also be heavily penalized. A dog that steals its brace mate's point must be ordered up by the judges... In a Non-Retrieving Stake,...a blank cartridge must be fired by the handler over any dog on point after the game has been flushed...A reasonable move of a dog to mark a bird flushed after a point is acceptable, but this shall not excuse a break or a delayed chase...

Retrieving is required in all Retrieving Stakes and counts as an important part of a dog's performance. After the shot, the handler shall not command or signal the dog to retrieve until the dog's steadiness to wing and shot has been positively demonstrated. The dog must retrieve promptly and tenderly to hand."

So there you have it, the Nationals at a glance! Pick an event or two (or all!) and join us for the fun and excitement!

Judge Doniere had a good look at each dog, while the arm-chair judges in the audience made their comparisons and picked their favorites. After due deliberation, the decision was final. Named as Best of Breed was Ch. Haans Meyer Thistledown, o/Greg & Pam Davis of Rockford, who was handled by his breeder Carri Paulson of Caledonia. Best of Opposite Sex went to Ch. Rosewood's Firecracker, CD, owned by Gary & Paulette Nelson of Wayzata, Mn., bred by Suzanne Bielmiere.

After all the excitement, it was TIME TO EAT! The picnic lunch which followed was super as usual, and the shade was a blessing to the more sunburn-prone among us. Since our Specialty is an annual affair that normally goes off without a hitch, it's easy to forget just how much work goes into the planning of such an event. FUN TRIAL REPORT from Jim Busch


In spite of a shortage of sleep and a slight hangover, we did make the fun trial. We delayed the usual 8:30am start for about an hour to allow for many missing regulars time to arrive. We started with the second event to give them more time even though there were many newcomers on deck early. Time was not what was needed! The day was hot. In spite of the heat, the dogs looked great. Judge after judge commented on how high the quality of the performances were.

"Dog of the Day" went to Dimitris Richie Whompum, owned and handled by the Jim Couris family. Richie ran in four of the field events and the Obstacle course. He was handled by each of the four Couris family members and placed every time. This is only the latest of many fun trials at which Richie's performances have garnered ribbons and trophies for the Couris'. He is and has been a consistently fine competitor each time he has entered. He is truly a worthy "Dog of the Day"!


Seven fine Vizslas earned their Certified Hunting Dog awards. To earn that certificate, the dog must hunt the course, respond to the handler's commands, find a bird, point staunchly, and retrieve a shot bird when presented with the opportunity. Gina Ordonez's puppy Chance earned his CHO in his first attempt at the tender age of four months old. I believe that Chance is the youngest dog to have earned his Certified Hunting Dog award.

The Obstacle Course replaced the Trick Contest. Deb Fridlund and Sharon Schroader, both of whom arrived several days early to help set up for the weekend, developed and laid out the eight obstacles that the dogs would negotiate. The obstacles in order were: 1) The Tunnel of Love 2) Jacob's Ladder 3)Bridge Over Troubled Lawn 4)Lover's Leap 5) Jump for Joy 6) Walking on Eggs 7) The Waterfall 8) The Throne. Each dog got 10 points for successfully completing each obstacle. Ten bonus points were earned if the obstacle was completed on the first attempt. Paula Abbott won with Ch. Nicole's Diamond Repete and a perfect score of 160. In addition, she did it in 31 seconds, which is very fast. Randy Boggs and Moose came in Fourth. Randy even threw in a "swan dive" on top of Moose between the "Bridge" and "Leap". We were all amazed that Moose even continued with Randy after being crushed from behind. How are the knees, Randy?

We finished up about 5:30pm. It was late, but judge Mike Florian, original owner of the legendary Willie's Bushwak Barney McGee, sat tall in the saddle 'til the end. Mike and family - yes, wife and kiddles Shawn and Evan, were suprise guests. Guests, however get no free ride at our fun trials. Mike, along with Art Ciolkowski graciously judged most of the stakes, Andie Ciolkowski came with Art and served as our "bookie" for the pigeon races.

VIZSLAS AND NATIONAL SHOOT-TO-RETRIEVE STAKES

The NSTRA holds field trials for all breeds of registered pointing dogs from coast to coast. The Field Dog Stud Book/American Field is the record keeping and sanctioning organization that the governs the sport. If you are a hunter, you'll love NSTRA competition.

The NSTRA started in Indiana as the Indiana Shoot-to-Retrieve Association. A bunch of hunters got together to test who had the best hunting dog. The movement has since spread across the nation and became the National Shoot-to-Retrieve Association. The rules have changed and have been defined more closely, but the emphasis has remained the same. FIND BIRDS! If the birds are handled in an acceptable fashion, the dog with the most finds wins. "More action per acre" is the subtitle of the NSTRA brochure, and that is an accurate description.

It costs \$10 to join. You get a belt buckle, a decal, a rule book, and a bi-monthly newsletter. The fall schedule just arrived. The sport is so popular that it behooves you to enter every trial you want to attend the day your schedule arrives. One event is run each day. Thirty two dogs maximum are allowed to run. First 32 entries get in. In some regions of the country, there are more dogs that want to run than there is room for in the trials. Enter early! That was the toughest lesson we had to learn while trying out the sport.

NSTRA awards a championship certificate to dogs that accumulate 18 points. Nine of them must be 1st place points. If there are 12-17 dogs entered, 1st gets one point; 18-25 dogs entered, 1st gets two points and 2nd gets one point; 26-32 dogs entered, 1st gets three points, 2nd gets two points, and 3rd gets one point.

Approximately 20 Vizslas have placed in NSTRA competition. Four of them have earned their Championship. Killion's Brown Sugar (bitch) was the first Vizsla Champion. She did it in 1980. Amber Sunshine (bitch) won the Texas Regional elimination in 1985 and earned her Championship. Askim (dog) was the first male Vizsla to earn a NSTRA Championship. He did it in 1987. Two weeks later, Ch. Solo became the second Vizsla male to earn the NSTRA Championship. It took Sugar six seasons to go from her first placement to her Championship. Back in '78-'80, there were not as many trials as there are now. It took Amber & Askim four seasons of competition to go from first placement to championship. Ch. Solo made the same trip in three seasons. Sugar and Amber did not compete in AKC trials, while Askim was an AKC Dual Champion when he began NSTRA and Solo entered NSTRA right out of AKC Derby.



In order to score well on your birds in NSTRA trials, the dog must point staunchly, remain still while the handler/gunner flushes, and then when the bird is shot, tenderly retrieve the bird to within 3 feet of the handler (to hand is best). Backing is scored once during each brace. The dog must back without caution or command. Once stopped, he is collared by the handler. Extra credit is not given for steady-to-wing-and-shot. You may elect to handle your dog and have a friend flush and gun. You can get your steady-to-wing-and-shot practice in, and if you find enough birds, win.

The trials take place in a 25 to 60 acre field. Six birds, usually quail, are released for the first brace and five birds for each brace thereafter. You walk, the judges are mounted. Your score - a numerical total is posted after you run. You can check to see how you did in relation to everyone else.

I won one trial with three finds, and have seen guys fail to place with five finds. Usually, four to five finds will get you in the placements.

It helps to be a bit philosophical in NSTRA competition. Usually 32 dogs compete. If you watch, you will admit that they are the best hunting dogs you have ever seen in your whole life. We have seen 11 month old pups place and 12 year old veterans win. Three placements get awarded. That means that approximately one out of each eleven dogs gets a placement. Your dog's share therefore is one placement every 5 1/2 weekends (11 entries). Once every 16 weekends, you can get a first place if you are taking your share. It should take three years of competing 16 weekends a year to finish your dog. If you are taking your share. Those Vizslas that really tried have beaten that schedule. Vizslas can and do well in this sport.

If you have a blinker, if you have a sloppy retriever, if you have a non-hunting runner, stay home! If you are a hunter with an insatiable bird-finder that retrieves to hand (or close) get your feet wet! You don't need a horse. Entry fees are reasonable (\$25-\$30). Trial grounds are close.
