Editor's comments: The National Specialty was the most spectacular event of the entire week at the Nationals. Last year when it was decided that we were going to use a Hungarian judge for the show specialty, there were a lot of us who weren't sure that was a good idea. Boy, were we wrong. It turned out to be the best thing that happened to Vizslas in a long time - especially if you field trial and show. Having come straight from Hungary, Miklos Farkashazi knew no one, owed no one, and looked for the combination field and show that most of us desire. He seemed to favor dogs with a deep chest. Three home-made movies from Hungary were shown at the dinner Saturday night and it seemed that the winners he picked most resembled those shown from Hungary in the movies. Probably the most outstanding thing he did that really upset the entire program was asking those entered to walk their dogs in the ring more than gaiting. Faults that don't show up when gaiting sure do tend to come out when walking. He even dismissed one dog for being too large. The professional show handlers really took a beating, and on the other hand, the field people who normally do not fair well in the show ring took a great percentage of the placements. It was the most exciting show I have ever been to in my life, and I normally do not care much for showing. I don't have my show catalog with me, but George Peirce's dog The Baron of Batavia placed 3rd in a group of approximately 30 Open Dogs. All I could remember was George saying he knew he didn't have a chance, but was entering just for the fun of it anyway. Well, George, the folks here in Illinois sure are proud.....especially us Busches since that is a Bing Bang puppy. The entire day was great from beginning to end and all those involved in putting on this spectacular event should be congratulated for such a fine day. also notice that "BARON" placed 3rd in the Puppy Sweepstakes 12-18 months, and Kathy Harmer's Polar Kap's BUCACO'S NUGGET placed 2nd in the Puppy Sweepstakes 12-18 months females.

NEWS BULLETIN FROM GAINES DOG RESEARCH CENTER, White Plains, New York

A "mostly Labrador Retriever" from Maryland broke a seven-way tie on the second day of competition to emerge victorious for the second time in the annual Cycle K-9 World Frisbee Catch and Fetch Contest.

Dink, the leaping Labrador mix, came through in fine style in the freestyle events to finish with 64 and one-third points. In second place with 62 points was Ivey Lee, a Yellow Labrador-German Shepherd Dog mixed breed, from Georgia, and third place went to KONA, A VIZSLA FROM ARIZONA, with 60 and one-third points.

The competition, which consists of complusory events on the first day and freestyle events on the second day, was cheered by more than 40,000 spectators at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California.

and, another bulletin from Gaines....

The publication of one of the most important books ever written on canine genetics has been announced, advises the Gaines Dog Research Center.

As the author, Dr. Frederick B. Hutt, explains in his introduction, "Genetics For Dog Breeders" has been written "chiefly to tell to dog breeder what principles of genetics can be useful in the effort to breed dogs conforming to his ideals and carrying a minimum of the 'genetic junk' that plagues all species."

In the 245-page book's 14 chapters, Dr. Hutt answers many key questions, such as: Is the condition necessary? How is it inherited? How can it be eliminated with the smallest loss of valuable dogs?

A holder of seven university degrees, Dr. Hutt taught at the University of Manitoba, Canada, the University of Minnesota and Cornell University in a career spanning more than 50 years. He is now Professor of Animal Genetics, Emeritus, at Cornell University. He has written three other books and almost 300 scientific papers on animal genetics.
